PORT EDWARD TOWNSITE DELIGHTED HUNDREDS

face building is nearing completion. Work has been started on the erection of a power house, for which \$183,000 has been appropriated, which is to be completed in August of this year. Altogether there are 125 men or more employed on the townsite.

While the harbor is not nearly as large as that of Prince Rupert, it is of sufficient size to accommodate the largest ocean going vessels. It is two miles long with a turning basin 2,000 feet across. At the entrance to the harbor there is a passage 550 feet wide with a depth of 36 feet at the lowest spring tides. One of the great advantages of the harbor is the possibility of building pier wharves. These can be built at an angle of 45 degrees to a length of 600 feet. At low water there will be a depth of 36 feet at the outer end and 26 feet at the inner end with little dredging. Eleven such piers are available, giving a combined docking length of 14,320 feet.

Columns and pages could be written in praise of the numerous advantages that Port Edward possesses as an industrial townsite. All that it lacks is the industries themselves to make it a scene of enterprise and activity and there seems little doubt that with the completion of the G. T. P., the opening of the Panama Canal and the development that is taking place all through Northern British Columbia these will come with almost unheard of rapidity.
