Strangest Will Ever Filed in a New England Court.

Boston, March 24.—Wedding bells will soon be ringing for Miss Mary Belle Shedd of Lowell, who will thus take the first step in an effort to win a legacy of \$3,000,000 under the terms of the strangest will ever filed in a New England court. Miss Shedd will lose \$3,000,000 unless she marries and bears children. As soon as this became known the young woman was deluged with marriage proposals, but the daughter of Freeman B. Shedd, the late wealthy perfume manufacturer, made her choice some time ago. Shedd died in Florida, leaving \$3,000,000, a widow and a daughter. By the terms of the will, Mrs. Shedd and her daughter are provided for for life. They will have an income but cannot obtain the principal unless Mary Belle Shedd shall wed. In case she leaves no children at the time of her death the money will be divided among the Berry School of Rome, Georgia; Northfield Seminary, the City of Lowell and the Lowell General Hospital.

Miss Shedd is also the sole executrix of this will, which takes disposition of her father's immense estate out of her hands unless she becomes a mother.

JULIAN HAWTHORNE IS SENT TO PRISON

New York, March 24.—Julian Hawthorne, Dr. William J. Morton and Albert Freeman, found guilty of using the United States mails to defraud, are being held in the Tombs awaiting the decision of their counsel as to whether their cases shall be appealed. They were convicted in connection with the promotion of mining properties in the Cobalt district of Ontario, properties which the three men knew to be worthless. Freeman was sentenced to five years and three days in the federal prison at Atlanta, Ga.; Hawthorne to one year and one day at Atlanta, and Morton also to one year and one day. Josiah Quincy, ex-mayor of Boston, was acquitted.

Hawthorne is a son of Nathaniel Hawthorne, the novelist. Morton is the son of the discoverer of ether. "This is the anaesthetic curse come upon me," declared Dr. Morton as he stood waiting in the office of the marshal for his hands to be manacled. "I am not surprised at the outcome of the trial; I have been expecting some tragic happening all my life, after the way the American people treated my father. I could only expect that something of a dire nature would happen to his son."
