A blue-sky law of a new variety is passing through the Nebraska legislation. It is aimed at the sale of foreign lands in that state, applying almost solely to the Canadian lands. Its main provisions are that all lands sold in the state must have been inspected by a state board for verification as to representations, that all agents must pay a license and put up a bond of \$10,000. If the representations as to the productivity of the land are not borne out by the subsequent experience of the purchaser, the shortage in returns may be obtained by legal means from the agent. No newspaper or other advertisement for foreign land may be published without approval of a state board to be created.
The object of the bill is apparently not so much to protect buyers of Canadian land against losses from misrepresentation, as to prevent entirely the sale of Canadian land and thus put an end to the migration of farmers to the Canadian west. This purpose is not likely to be fully accomplished, but so far as the bill will protect the Nebraska investor against wildcat subdivisions and fraudulent statements respecting the location of farming land, its object is entitled to a certain sympathy. The methods used in selling town lots to investors in Eastern Canada, Britain, and in some parts of the U. S., are not always such as could be recommended as good for the reputation of the country.

San Francisco, March 31.—Intimations are that the second Wolgast-Murphy bout, scheduled by the promoter for April 26, might be called off by Wolgast if the date were not advanced as heard today. Tom Jones, Wolgast's manager, telephoned the office of Coffroth, the promoter, from the former champion's training quarters last night that April 12 or 19 would be satisfactory to his man, but that the 26th was too late.
"We have other plans for the latter part of April," he declared. Coffroth was out of town. It was said, however, that the date fixed was tentative and could probably be set forward.

BIG SALARY FOR CATCHER
Star Cub Archer Has Signed with the Chicago Nationals.

Chicago, March 31.—James Archer signed a four year contract as catcher of the Chicago Nationals late this afternoon. Archer has been holding out for a salary of \$7,500, and while neither he nor President Murphy would say at what stipend he signed, it was reported that a compromise at \$6,000 was effected. Both Murphy and Archer declared they were very well satisfied with their agreement. The catcher will join the team at Louisville in a few days.

LIGHTWEIGHTS TO FIGHT
Knockout Brown to Meet Bud Anderson on the Fifteenth

Los Angeles, Cal., March 31.—The return match between Knockout Brown, the New York lightweight, and Bud Anderson, of Medford, Or., will occur the night of April 15. They will box twenty rounds at the Vernon arena. In the previous fight Brown and Anderson boxed a terrific twenty round draw.

Japan Will Exhibit.
Honolulu, March 29.—Lars Anderson, retiring United States ambassador at Tokyo, who arrived here today on the liner Manchuria, en route to Washington, declared there was no foundation for reports that Japan would not exhibit at the Panama-Pacific international exposition in 1915 at San Francisco if the anti-Japanese legislation pending before the California legislature were put through.

Seek Canadian Mail Contract
London, March 29.—The contract for the Canadian mails, which has been held continuously by the Allan line since 1853, expires on May 1. All the British steamship lines on the route have lately been increasing their fleets in order to make a tender for the service.

Alaska Legislature at Juneau Passes a Resolution

Juneau, Alaska, March 29.—The Alaska legislature took steps this morning to aid the stricken states of the Middle West.
Senator Millard, at the request of President Ray, introduced a joint resolution providing for the appointment of a joint committee representing both houses of the Legislature, with full powers to act. Under a suspension of the rules the resolution was passed and hastened to the house where it was quickly put through on final passage.
The committee will communicate with every village, town and city in Alaska to secure contributions for the tornado and flood victims.

UNITED STATES NOT
JEALOUS OF CANADA

Ambassador Bryce Delivers Message of Good Will from President Wilson.

Ottawa, March 29.—Right Hon. James Bryce, British ambassador at Washington, was the guest of the Canadian Club at a banquet in the Chateau Laurier a few days ago. He was welcomed by the chairman as one of the Empire's foremost men and described by the Prime Minister as one who has climbed the height of almost every phase of human intellectual achievement, as a student, idealist, man of letters, parliamentarian, constitutionalist, minister of the Crown and diplomat.

Imperial unity was the keynote of Mr. Bryce's address, but in the course of his remarks he made an interesting reference to the work of the British embassy at Washington and delivered a message of good will to Canada from President Wilson and Secretary of State W. J. Bryan. In part, he said:

"It has been my privilege to sign either eleven or twelve treaties—I am not at this moment quite certain which—with the United States government since I went to Washington, and of that number nine have been treaties relating to the affairs of Canada. By those nine treaties we have, I hope, dealt with all the questions that are likely to arise between the United States and Canada—questions relating to boundary; questions relating to the disposal of and the use of boundary waters; questions relating to the fisheries in the international waters where the two countries adjoin one another; questions relating to the interests which we have in the Behring Sea, and many other matters, which it would take too long to go into at this moment—and I am happy to say that I do not think your relations with the United States ever stood upon a better footing than they do now."
