# 1 W B C Worker ciled

A 23 - year - old sawmill employee was killed yesterday afternoon when crushed by a bundle of lumber while working in the yards of the Prince Rupert Sawmills Ltd.

Dead is Mehar Singh Saggu, a former resident of Vancouver who was living at the employees' quarters at the sawmill.

Sawmill manager J. H. Mann said that Saggu was apparently moving two bundles of four-inch by four-inch lumber with a forklift vehicle when the top bundle of about 22 beams slid backwards off the lift, crushing the roof of the vehicle and Saggu.

The death, which occurred about 3:40 p.m. was the first industrial fatality in more than a

Mr. Mann said the bundles of lumber, 13 feet long, were held together by metal straps. They didn't break, he said.

The sawmill manager said that Saggu had been driving a forklift vehicle for about five years. Viewing of the body was scheduled for 4 p.m. today at Ferguson, Funeral Home with Coroner George E. Dawes officiating.
