Three men on survey

A Toronto man in a rubber | 'raft left Wednesday to meet two | companions at the Nass River to take part in a geological survey | of the British Columbia coast. William Hutchison's two partners, Keith Bagnall of Calgary Advertising in The Doily News and Walter Born of Vancouver are constructing a camp at the Nass River for a main base as

they flew in by plane. The trio is preparing to map, the rock formation of the entire coast of British Columbia in a government plan which will take five years to complete.

The raft itself is very stable and is 12 feet in length and four, feet at its widest point. The craft is powered by an 18 horsepower motor.

It has two inflatable compartments and a wooden frame that. fits inside. The raft can be folded down into two packages with total weight of 150 pounds. With a full load the vessels can average about 30 miles per l


Mr. Hutchison said the best way to describe the craft is that it is "like a cork."



# The Corporation of the City of Prince Rupert

Under the provisions of the "Municipal Act" resident-electors and tenantelectors may be placed on the Voters' List, provided the necessary declaration is filled with the City Clerk.

A resident-elector is a person who is a British subject of the full age of 21 years and who is a resident and has resided continuously for not less than six months within the City of Pichee Rupert immediately prior to the submission of the declaration provided for a Section 34 of the "Municipal Act" and whose name 1, not entered on the list be at owner-elector.

A tending-elector is a person who is a British subject of the full age of 21 years or it is a Corporation and no or it is a tenant in occupation of real property within the City of Prince Rupert and he or it has been a tenant in occupation of real property within the City of Prince Rupert continuously for not less than six months immediately prior to the robbission of the declaration provided for in Section 34 of the Municipal Act and his or its name is not entered on the list as an owner or resident elector

A corporation may qualify as a tenant-elector and file the necessary declaration. Corporations which are property owners in the City of Prince Rupert may be placed on the voters' list provided they file a written authorization naming a person 21 years of age or over who is a British subject to be its agent to vote on behalf of the corporation; such authorization shall be filed with the Clerk not later than the 30th day of September in the year in which the list is certified and remains in force until revoked or replaced by the Corporation.

Declaration forms are obtainable from the City Clerk's Office, City Hall, Prince Rupert, B.C.

All declarations must be delivered to the City Clerk before five (5) o'clock in the alternoon of the thirtieth (30) day of September 1962.
