



problems, treatment be discussed at meeting

A public meeting to acquaint parents with the need and reason of their children's early dental care will be held at 8 p.m. Thursday at the Skeena Health Unit, it was reported by Dr. G. P. Evans, director of the unit.

Three dentists, Dr. R. M. Waddell. Dr George Mostad and Doctor Hector MacDonald, will be on hand to speak, and a film and demonstration will be given. Anyone is welcome to attend the meeting, Dr. Evans said, but only four-and-five-year-old children may be registered for the dental program.

Dr. Evans said that this year the dental program is for pre-schoolers only, and there is a limited time for registration. A fee of \$6 will be charged, and this will cover all the treatment found to be needed on the initial diagnosis. The previous program which included children of Grade 1 was found to be too time-consuming and expensive, so that is why the age and registration limit has been cut down, the director said.
