The dispute has held up major exploration plans of several big companies, some of them interested in oil deposits off the coast of Vancouver Island and the Queen Charlottes.

B.C. was prepared to take its case to court when the previous Conservative government refused to budge.

In announcing he will also seek \$7,000,000 and a new federal-provincial agreement on the Stewart-Cassiar Road, Mr. Kiernan noted that Ottawa has already contributed half of the \$10,000,000 spent so far and is committed for half of \$4,000,000 work now under contract.

But completion of the route would cost another \$14,000,000. including bridges, the minister said, and B.C. can't go ahead because the previous agreement allowed only for an additional \$1,-

He said he would also press for improvements to the port of Stewart and said he plans to invite Mr Laing to tour the area with him in August.
