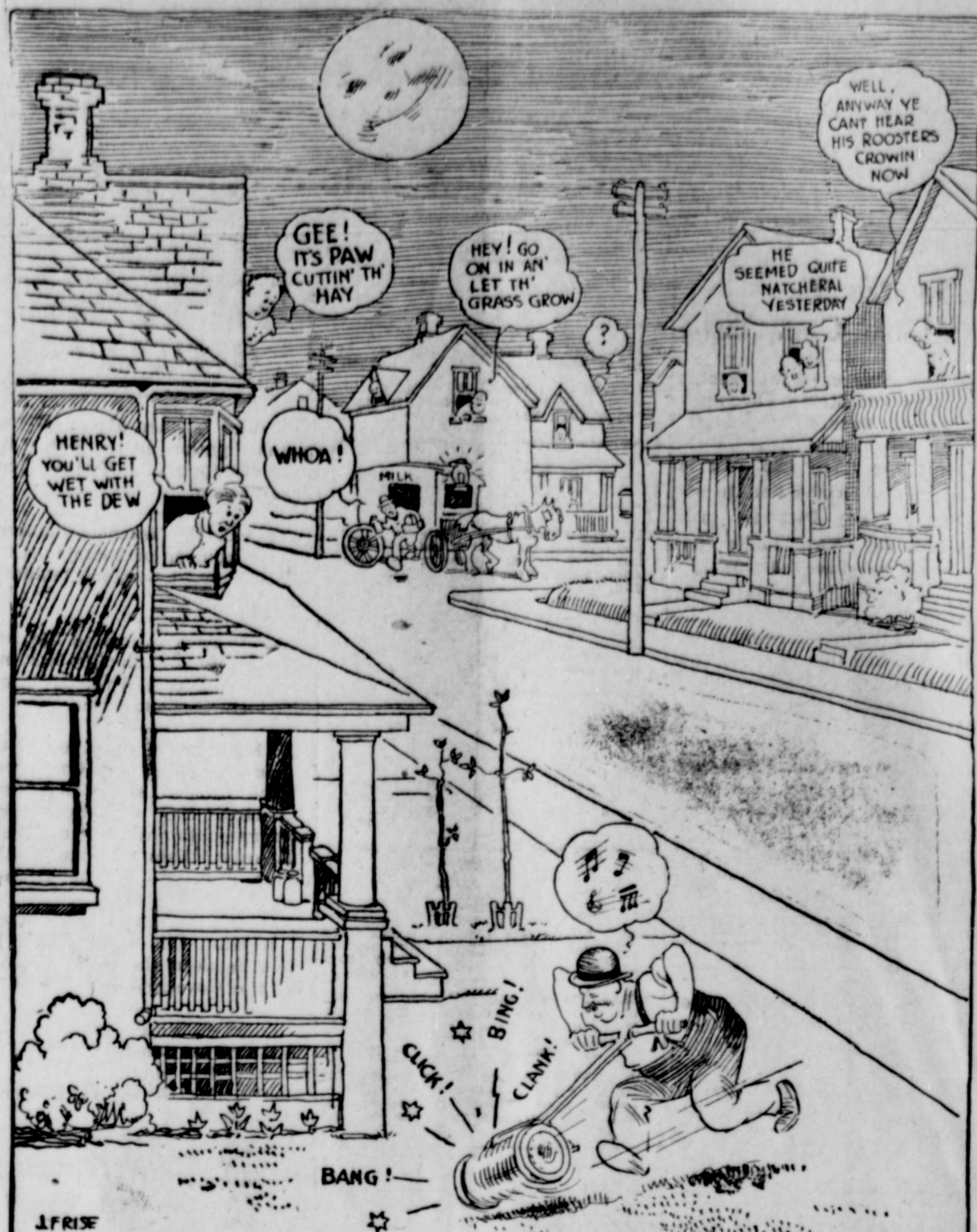

INTERNATIONAL RULES FOR SQUARED CIRCLE

Scheme by Which Boxing the World Over Will Be Under Competent Control. New York, May 27.—Not only is a movement for an American Boxing association well under way, but, in addition, plans for international control of boxing are now being carefully perfected. Every country that now maintains boxing—America, England, France and Australia—and several that are preparing to foster the sport are on record with a heavy approval of some scheme by which boxers and boxing contests throughout the world will be under the supervision of an international board of control.

Although the details have not been as yet decided on, there is small doubt of the formation of a board composed of one or two representatives from each country to carry out and enforce the rules adopted by an international organization for the world-wide standardization of the sport.

London, May 26.—The admiralty announces the promotion of Rear Admiral C. E. Kingsmill, R. N., to be a vice admiral.
