adventurous as any. "Slim" was the son of a presbyterian clergyman at Stanley, New Brunswick. When a youth some fifteen years ago he became attacked with the wanderlust and set out on his travels. He visited the mining camps of Nevada

and Montana, where he made enough to keep him going. He was in the van of the rush to the Yukon in 1896 and made some big strikes. While there he became an explorer as well as miner and traveled the country far and near. He was in the Treadwell camp, but here fortune did not favor him. He got his nickname of "Slim" in the North-west Mounted Police, in which he served for some time afterwards.

He was a pioneer in the Cobalt and Gowganda stampedes, but did not meet with much luck until he staked in the Shining Tree camp, in which he is said to have made a fortune.

In Northern Ontario he continued his explorations, which were this time in Ungava. It is said that no man knew this large cold uninhabited peninsula as well as "Slim." He was passionately fend of traveling in these wilds and while sick in the hospital was planning a northern trip.
