As stated in our telegraphic despatches yesterday, on South Bruce, East Middlesex and South Lanark in Ontario and Chateauguay in Quebec have been conferred the distinction of being the first constituencies in Canada to pronounce a verdict on the action of the several parties to the great naval contest which will sooner or later be forced on the Deminion of Canada, As Liberals in and out of parliament are eager to have a chance to appeal to the public opinion of the Dominion on this subject, there is but one course for them to pursue; make ready for the by-elections by selecting their strongest candidates, perfecting their organizations, and taking steps to have the naval issue, in all its aspects, put fairly and squarely before the electors.


