TREACHEROUS FRASER

Over One Hundred Drownings Expected During Coming Season.

A correspondent writes to the Fort George Herald that in all probability there have been twenty people drowned already this spring, who have found a grave in the Fraser. There are only seven really dangerous places on the Fraser between Tete Jaune Cache and Quesnel which are dangerous at all stages of water to inexperienced boatmen and frail craft, namely, Goat Rapids, Upper Grand Canyon, Lower Grand Canyon, Giscombe Rapids, Willow River Reef, Fort George Canyon and Cottonwood Canyon. The travel on the river has not rightly started. If anything like the present rate of drowning accidents—keeps on, there will be over one hundred people meet their death on the section of the river above referred to, not saying anything of the thousands of dollars worth of supplies and valuables.

Regular Mails for Dawson.

Although years have been spent in bringing it about, late Yukon mail contracts awarded show marked improvement in mail service over that of former times. The White Pass Company was the successful bidder in the matter of carrying the Whitehorse-Dawson and Carcross-Atlin mails for the coming year. But in the matter of the Whitehorse-Dawson mail the new contract stipulates that all the mail all the time must be transported. This means much for the Dawson people, who have hitherto suffered great inconvenience in securing other than first class mail during the closed seasons. Now, however, they will get their mail promptly, regardless of the season or of trail conditions.—Whitehorse Star.
