Neglect of United States Government May Force Natives to Eat Seal Meat.

Washington, June 17 .- Famstarvation, threatens the people of the Pribiloff Island of Alaska, as a result of congressional delay in passing the sundry civil bill, according to the department of commerce.

There are food supplies on the island for only a month longer, and until funds are provided the department can send no more. The bill is now in the house and senate with no immediate prospect of final disposition.


