Lighthouse and Foghorn for Entrance of Portland Canal. Word has been received from Prince Rupert that the lighthouse tender Estevan, of the Marine and Fisheries department, is due here next week to replace the buoys in the harbor. According to Captain Saunders, head of the department in the north, recommendations have been made for a lighthouse and foghorn at Portland Point, the entrance to Portland Canal, and for lights on Hetty Island, Stick Point and in the harbor at a point off the Portland City wharf.—Portland Canal Mimer.
