FRENCH GIRLS IN MONTREAL RAISING MONEY "TO EDUCATE ONTARIO."

The Girls Who Sell "La Penses Francaise."

Hundreds of young women are selling buttons and flags on the streets of Montreal. On the buttons is a red, white and blue pansy with the words "La Penses Francaise." The object of the crusade is to collect all the money possible to aid in the propagation of the French language in Canada. One of these pretty French-Canadian girls naively put it this way: "We are collecting money for the education of Ontario."

ROMANCE UNEXPLODED BY RECENT EVIDENCE

Suicide of Supposedly Wealthy Swiss Couple Was Occasioned by Loss of Fortune.

Zurich, July 2.—The mystery surrounding the suicide last Thursday of Eugene Maggi, reputed one of the wealthiest men in Switzerland, and his wife has been cleared up by the discovery among Maggi's papers of a letter to his family saying that he had been irretrievably ruined financially and had decided to kill himself. Underneath this message in his wife's firm handwriting was the following:

"I believed myself rich and I was happy. Eugene has just revealed to me that we are ruined and announces his determination to die. My duty is to follow him in death. Adieu."

An investigation has confirmed the fact that Maggi had lost his all.

When Maggi and his wife were found dead as a result of gas asphyxiation in their bedroom in their villa here it was believed that their suicide had been prompted by the fact that although their wealth was estimated at \$10,000,000, they were greatly disappointed because they were childless. Maggi was the owner of 104 flour mills in Zurich and other parts of Switzerland, and had numerous other widespread interests.

MILLION MORE VOTERS

Governor of Illinois Signs Equal Suffrage Bill.

Springfield, Ill., July 1.—Governor Edward F. Dunne signed equal suffrage bill at 9:50 this morning, enfranchising 1,000,000 women, more than doubling the number of women in the United States now entitled to vote.

Grouped about the governor were women of the suffrage lobby, Senator H. S. Magill, father of the bill; Lieutenant Governor O'Hara and Speaker McKinley. Illinois is the first state bordering on the Mississippi to grant women the vote. The suffrage lobby presented the governor with a bouquet and compliments of one million women.

WOMEN ARE STEALING THE STYLE FROM MEN

Cuff Skirts, Turned Up at Bottom Like Trousers and with Slit, Is Modish.

New York, July 1.—Women are stealing men's styles, or at least the names of men's styles, for their fashions—witness the cuff skirt turned up around the bottom like a man's trousers and not much wider except for a slash in the front, and the pegtop skirt, which is designed to give the wearer room to sit down, if not to walk.

The slash, which makes walking possible, is to continue, however, for delegates from twenty-two out of thirty-four states represented at the National Ladies' Tailoring and Dressmaking Association, which opened its sessions here today, are in favor of it. Some of the skirts which will be shown have two slits. One of the double slit skirts, which comes from Chicago, has another innovation, a pistol pocket. There is a corresponding patent pocket on the left, possibly intended for a powder puff.

The convention, which, by the way, is entirely made up of men, will fight the latest Paris edict that skirts are to be from seven to ten inches from the floor. A large majority, including members from Boston, are in favor of tight slit skirts.

TWO SURVEYORS DROWNED

Wolves Besiege Hubbell Government Party.

Winnipeg, July 1.—Timber wolves for three days besieged the government Hubbell surveying party in a muskeg 35 miles north of Battleford, Sask., and later two of the party were drowned, according to word received here today. The two drowned were Horace Townsend and Jerome Leveque. The party had used practically all its ammunition in standing off the wolves when aid came.

Montreal, July 1.—It is likely that Hon. W. S. Fielding will be editor of the Telegraph, the new Liberal paper.

DRAMATIC INCIDENT IN SCOTT WILL CASE

Lady Sackville and Her Daughter Furtively Visited Library of Deceased Baronet.

London, July 1.—Suggestions of possible highly interesting developments were introduced today in the fight "for the millions," as the public calls the suit over the will of the late Sir John Murray Scott. The will leaves \$5,000,000 to Lady Sackville, a relative of a former British minister at Washington. Frederick Smith, counsel for those who are trying to break the will, mentioned an alleged secret visit to the baronet's house by Lady Sackville.

"She was seen," he said, "at the drawer of a desk in Sir John's library, and Major Arbuthnot, a friend of Scott's will testify that on his arrival to dine with Sir John one evening he opened the door of the library and saw Lady Sackville and Miss Sackville just shutting a drawer of the writing desk. Major Arbuthnot withdrew, but while he was still in the hall Lady Sackville opened the door a little and glanced around. Then she and her daughter left the house in what appeared to the major to be a very hurried and unusual manner."

"When Major Arbuthnot later saw Sir John he mentioned that he had seen Lady Sackville in the library. Sir John immediately became intensely agitated and broke into perspiration. Scott had no idea that Lady Sackville was in the house."

The lawyer said that the Sackvilles were known in the Scott family under the nickname of "The Locusts," while in the servants' hall Lady Sackville was referred to as "The Earthquake."

CAPTURED A WOLF

Right in the Heart of the City of Brandon

Brandon, July 1.—While cycling down Tenth Street here early this morning, a photographer named W. L. Legge ran across a wolf and gave chase, capturing the animal about two miles from the spot in about half an hour. Tenth Street runs through the very heart of the city. Two dollars bounty was later paid by the city treasurer.
