Rev. Dr. Johnson, of the American Presbyterian Church at Montreal, is in town on his way to Stewart. He is accompanied by his wife and little daughter.

Rev. Dr. Johnson frequently lectures in the cities of the United States on the development of Canada and particularly of the Canadian West, with which he is well acquainted. He is taking his present trip to extend his knowledge of the coast. He is delighted with his trip so far and notes great development in the west since his earlier visits to it. He notes especially that the settlement of the last few years has been of a much more permanent character than was formerly the case. In British Columbia he finds all the varieties of country to be found in Western Europe. He looks to the western coast as the future centre of civilization.

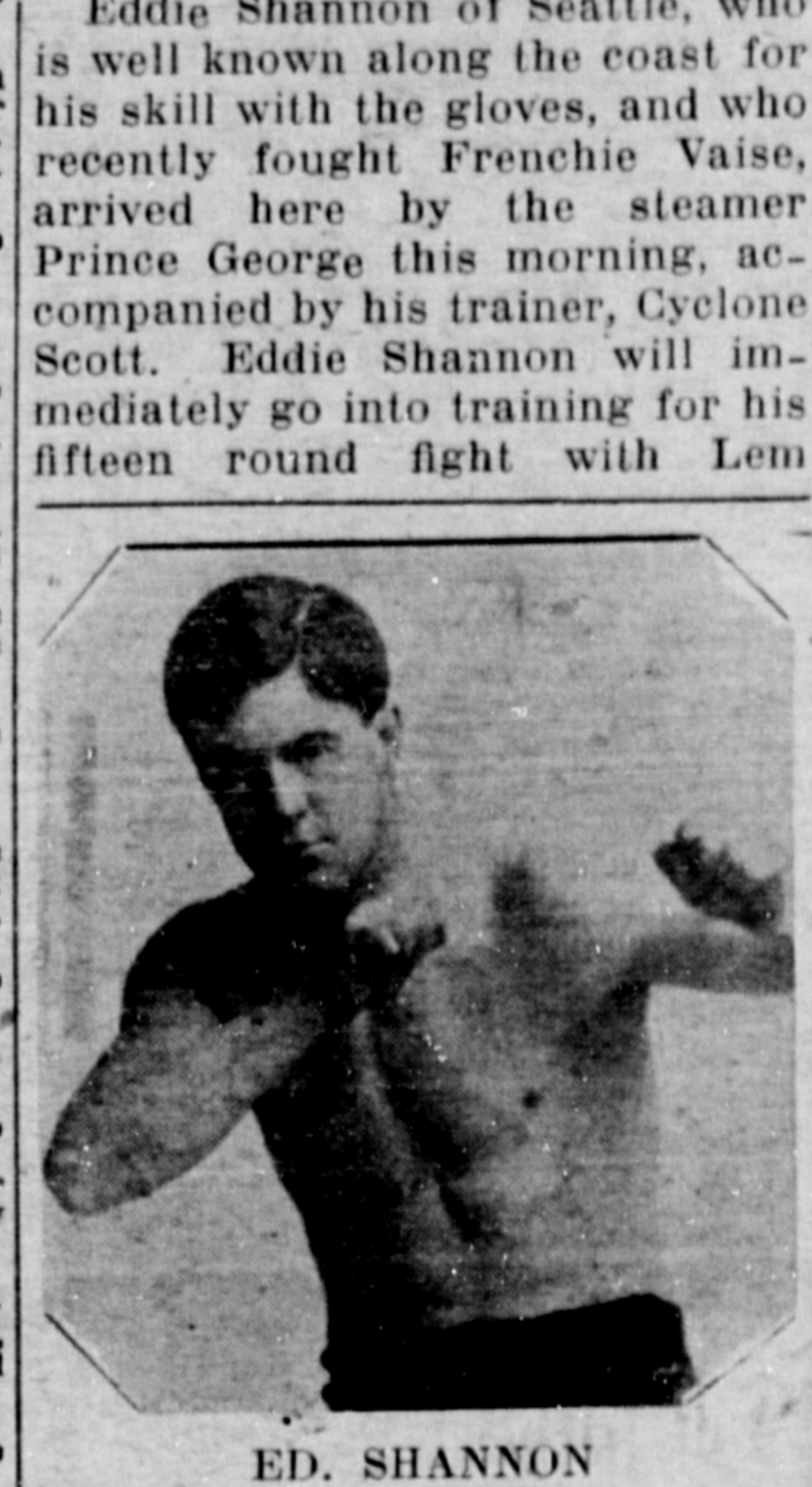
