THE ENGLISH ATTITUDE TO EMIGRATION.

A writer in the Spectator says some shrewd and pertinent things regarding the present panic caused by the tide of colonial emigration. While admitting the serious depletion of Scotland, he points out that a very different condition applies to England, where there is an enormous increase in the urban populations. Whatever is true of Scotland, in England and Wales emigration has not yet overtaken the natural increase in the population. Taking London as a typical example, this writer points out that the population of Greater London has increased by close upon a million within ten years, and that it is still growing. Thus, in the week ending May 17th there were 2,347 births in Greater London, as against 1,596 deaths. This means that in spite of the alleged declining birth rate there is an excess of 750 births over deaths in Greater London alone, and the same is true of nearly all the large towns. I comes to this, therefore, that instead of fearing emigration the question the people of England have to face is how to deal with the tremendous growth of their urban population. The population of England and Wales has been increasing by leaps and bounds since the beginning of the nineteenth century, and the increase has never been greater than during the

first decade of the twentieth


