WASHINGTON WOMEN ATTEMPT TO REDUCE COST OF LIVING

HOUSEWIVES OF REPUBLICAN CAPITAL HAVE RESOLVED TO ELIMINATE THE MIDDLEMAN—THEY WILL DEAL DIRECT WITH FARMERS

Washington, July 21—A novel attempt to reduce the high cost of living by eliminating the middlemen in meats and green groceries through direct dealings with farmers, is to be tried here by a concern in which several office-holders under the Taft administration are officials. Plans for the movement have been under way for some time, but actual operations began only today.

About 1000 local housewives many of them women of standing in social circles are associated with the movement in a co-operative and advisory capacity. A preliminary survey of market conditions in Washington has been made, and the published

statistics seem to place the responsibility for the soaring prices upon the middleman. Tabulation of prices taken in all corners of the capital allege profits ranging from 100 to 33 per cent. These admittedly are offset by waste and business costs.

The new movement proposes to gather provisions from the country side with a fleet of motor trucks and deliver them to the kitchen doors in sealed boxes upon order given the day before. The leaders of the movement say they will pay the farmer 20 per cent. more than he now gets and sell directly to consumers for 40 per cent. less than they now pay.
