Cunningham, the general inspector of fisheries for this coast.

The Fispa last evening brought in H. S. Clements, M. P.; D. N. McIntyre, the deputy commissioner of fisheries for the province, and Mr. Cunningham himself. Mr. Cunningham has recently been making an inspection of the canneries.
