

WARRANT FOLLOWS PRINCE Marshals Pursue Noble and His

San Francisco, Aug. 8 .- The honeymoon of Prince Stanislaus Sulkowski and his bride of a fortnight, who was Miss Marie Louise Freese of Los Angeles, has become a game of hide and seek between the prince and deputy United States marshals of two states.

As a result of testimony given by Mrs. Clara Melcher, a Viennese laundress, a warrant was issued in Los Angeles, at the request of the United States attorney there, charging the prince with violation of the Mann act, known as the white slave law.

Mrs. Melcher gave the prince some uneasy hours in Los Angeles, but before the warrant was sworn out he and his bride left, according to the best information of the marshal's office, for Lake Tahoe, which lies on the California-Nevada boundary.

ANOTHER OLD WHALER

Added to Fleet of the Atlin Fisheries, Ltd.

The Charlotte Cox is another old whaler that has been added to the local fleet of the Atlin Fisheries, Ltd. This is one of the largest auxiliary fishing schooners on the coast. She is being refitted entirely, and will leave Vancouver for the fishing banks on the 15th. She will probably bring a load of sockeye up with her. This makes four schooners, three large and one medium size, on the fleet of the Atlin Fisheries; Ltd. Another vessel of the Atlin Fisheries, Ltd., the Borealis, has been engaged to bring up a load of sockeye for the canneries.

The local shortage of sockeye has been so considerable this season that Mr. Lord, the manlager of the cannery department of the Canadian Fish and Cold Storage Company, recently went south to get a supply of Fraser River sockeye.
