MISTAKEN IDEA OF PANAMA CANAL.

It is a very general error of understanding that when the Panama Canal is completed the waters of the Atlantic will meet and mingle with those of the Pacific. They will not, unless they meet down at Cape Horn. There has been a half accepted theory that the waters of the Pacific are on a higher level than those of the Atlantic on this side of the isthmus, and several writers have said that a swift current might flow through the canal. The error is easily discerned when one thinks for a moment. The canal is not on the water level. but far above it, nearly 100 feet. On the Atlantic side the canal has been cut some distance inland to where the mountain begins to rise, and there a great lock is built, and when a ship enters it it is raised up to the level of the canal by means of river water, not sea. Crossing the mountan by canal and lake full of fresh water, the ship is let down into the salt water on the Pacific side. The salt waters do not meet, but are

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
