GREECE AND TURKEY LIKELY TO GO TO WAR AGAIN SOON

SUBLIME PORTE HAS NUMEROUS EXCUSES FOR NOT SIGNING PEACE TREATY—ARMY OF GREECE STILL MAINTAINED ON WAR FOOTING

Athens, Nov. 10.—Public sentiment here is growing more anxious as regards the outcome of the Graco-Turkish negotiations.

It is remarked that a common ground for agreement was found thirteen days ago, but Turkey, on one excuse or another, has refused to sign the treaty of peace. The last time the two governments were in union the Turks delayed final action thirty days and then re-opened the whole question.

Both the Greeks and Turkish armies are on a war footing. Greece maintains her full army force in Macedonia. On her army and navy she is spending \$25,000,000 a month.

HIGH COMMISSIONER OF SOUTH AFRICA

Sir Richard Solomon, One of the Wealthiest Men in Transvaal, Passes Away.

London, Nov. 10.—Sir Richard Solomon, high commissioner in London for the Union of South Africa, died today, aged 63.

Sir Richard was one of the wealthiest men in the Transvaal. He held several high positions in that country after the close of the Boer war and when the Union of South Africa was formed he was made a member of the native law commission and chairman of the mining commission. He was an Afrikaner, but a graduate of Cambridge.

Sir Richard's only daughter is the wife of Sir Percy Girouard, the Canadian soldier who is active in the management of the Canadian branch of Armstrong, Whitworth & Co., the great shipbuilding firm.

One of the largest single items of expense is for the salaries and expenses of detectives. One New York agency head drew \$8,950 for himself and employees. His salary was \$25 a day, and at times he employed thirty operators at \$8 a day.

Juvy, France, Nov. 10.—Maurice Chevillard, the French aviator, made several complete aerial loops in a biplane this afternoon before 1,000 spectators. FERDINAND IS AFRAID TO RETURN TO SOFIA

Now in Vienna Having Daily Conferences with Emperor and Foreign Minister.

Rome, Nov. 10.—The belief prevails in diplomatic circles that failing some assurance from Austria of future support in his present difficult position, King Ferdinand of Bulgaria will never venture back to his capital. King Ferdinand is now in Vienna, where he has had a protracted audience with the Emperor and is in almost daily conference with the Austrian foreign minister, Count von Berchtold.

The Bulgarians have no feeling of dynastic loyalty to Ferdinand. He is a German prince and the public apathy toward him in recent years has now changed to resentment under the influence of newspaper allusions to him as the author of the disastrous war between Greece and Servia.

Anonymous letters are stated to have been received threatening the King with death if he returns to Sofia. Should his mission to Vienna fail, King Ferdinand is credited with the intention of abdicating in favor of his eldest son, Crown Prince Boris, who will be 20 years old in January, and who has been brought up in the Orthodox faith, and is regarded with greater sympathy than his father.
