BIG LAWSUIT ABOUT MINE NEAR SMITHERS

Dispute as to Payment of Hundred Thousand Dollar Bond on Claims

In a dispute over the payment of the \$100,000 bond on the Silver Creek group of mineral claims, near Smithers, heard in Vancouver, Chief Justice Hunter continued an injunction restraining Richard G. Steele from paying the balance of \$35,000 to Peter Schufer and Lyman Wood until the trial of an action brought against them by Robert Lyons, of Kamloops. The latter alleges that he, Schufer and Wood were the original prospectors and owners of the property. R. G. Steele, who has been made a party to the suit, secured an option for \$100,000 which has all been paid except the amount in question. This amount he is ready to pay, but is holding it by order of the court, until the adjustment of the dispute. The property has been turned to an English company.


