### KILLED HER HUSBAND AND BABY WITH AXE

#### Terrible Deed of Insane Mother, Who Afterward Jumped from the Train.

Coronation, Alta., Nov. 17.—Angus Flynn is dead in a hospital here as the result of injuries inflicted with an axe by his wife last Tuesday. Flynn conducted a hardware store at Thorne, eight miles east of Coronation. On Tuesday his wife was seized with a violent attack of insanity. With an axe she killed her baby daughter and when Flynn interfered he was struck several times with the same weapon. He was brought here for treatment and Mrs. Flynn was taken to Calgary. While in the custody of an officer on the train on Thursday Mrs. Flynn jumped through a window while the train was moving rapidly, but escaped serious injury. She is held on a charge of murder, but will probably be committed to the Ponoka asylum.

Yesterday, for the first time in thirty-four years, Ah Luck cast his eyes upon a railway train. He boarded it at Hazelton yesterday morning and reached Prince Rupert last night. Ah Luck, as may be imagined, is a Chinaman. He landed in Victoria thirty-four years ago on a China boat. He took a river boat to Yale and spent some sixteen or seventeen years in the Cariboo country. At the end of that time he went into the Omineca country where he has been ever since. Ah Luck is a miner. He is going down to Vancouver, he says, to spend a week and then return to the Omineca. ### "OUT OF THE DEPTHS"

#### Thrilling Death of Villain by Act of Providence

The feature at the Empress theatre tonight and tomorrow night will be the production of an Essanay drama entitled "Out of the Depths." It is a play splendid in its characterization, its scenery and its mechanical effect, such as the great electric storm to which is attributed the final tragedy.

The story is one of the simplest. A plodding book-keeper has a sick mother to whom he is devoted. She can only live a few days unless sent to another climate. He asks his employer for an advance and is refused. He takes enough money to serve the purpose, intending to replace it out of his next pay. The purloining is discovered and he gets a five year sentence.

One of his fellow clerks turns up and threatens to denounce him as an ex-convict. Black mail is paid for a time but when the clerk threatens to inform the girl the mayor is about to marry there is a powerful quarrel scene and the black-mailer is thrown out. Through a blinding storm he makes for the home of the girl. There is a vivid flash of lightning. His dead body is found crumpled up on the girl's doorsteps.
