LUMBER PRODUCTION. Statistics Show Marked Decrease From Last Year's Cut. The total cut of lumber in Canada in 1912 was 4,389,723,000 feet, board measure, valued at \$69,475,784.

There were also cut in Canada during this period 1,578,343,000 shingles valued at \$3,175,319; 899,016,000 lath, valued at \$2,064,622, and 65,906 tons of square timber, valued at \$1,825,154.
