### WHEN THE WHALE DISAPPEARS.

Elsewhere in this issue will be found an article from Seattle propounding the theory that the killing off of the whales in the waters along the Alaskan coast is ruining the herring industry, just as a similar condition did in Norway. The argument is that as the whales no longer chase the herring into the shallow waters and consequently herring do not school in the small bays until they are ready to spawn, at which time they are useless for food.

The theory is not greatly credited here, where there is one of the best herring banks in the north. There were very few whale here last winter, yet tremendous schools of herring
