HINDUS GIVING TROUBLE ON BOTH SIDES OF THE WORLD

ANOTHER BATCH OF TWENTY LANDED AT VICTORIA A FEW DAYS AGO—VICEROY OF INDIA ENQUIRING INTO HINDUS IN SOUTH AFRICA.

Victoria, Nov. 27.—After having just completed the examination of a contingent of fifty-six Hindus and unravelling a great immigration problem, the officials at the Victoria detention buildings are now face to face with another similar task.

When the liner Chicago, Maru berthed from the Orient this morning it was learned that there were twenty natives of the Indian Empire booked to this port, and after a brief examination they were permitted to disembark and escorted to the detention buildings, where exhaustive examinations will be made as to their health and certificates.

London, Nov. 27.—Lord Hardinge, viceroy of India, made an unusual and remarkable speech on Tuesday with regard to the alleged ill treatment of the Hindu laborers in South Africa. He referred in sympathetic terms to the courage of the East Indians in their passive resistance to invidious and unjust laws, and again demanded a thorough and impartial enquiry.
