J. W. Grant, Chief of Police, of Bingham, Utah, who was shot and killed by Ralph Lopez, was a former Nova Scotian, having been born near Hopewell, Pictou County, forty-nine years ago.

### SATURDAY SESSION

Chambers Applications Disposed of By Judge Before Regular Sitting.

The civil cases, apart from the two jury trials that are to come up this week, took but a little time to dispose of yesterday in the Supreme Court before Mr. Justice Murphy.

Sitting in chambers early in the morning there were several applications made before His Lordship. L. W. Patmore, appearing for Indian Mines Ltd. (non-personal liability), Copper Cliff Mines Ltd. (non-personal liability), Hazelton Mines Ltd. (non-personal liability), Silver Cup Mines Ltd. (non-personal liability), made application for an extension of the time for filing allotment and agreement for stock in lieu of cash.

The application was allowed. In Carter et al vs. B. C. Fisheries an application made by R. O. Fulton for leave to issue a writ of summons was granted by His Lordship.

Sitting in court later, His Lordship heard the application in the divorce action of Beatty vs. Beatty. The divorce was granted on a decree absolute.

In the case of Chapman vs. Chapman, also a divorce proceeding, a decree absolute was granted. In both of these cases A. Manson appeared for the applicants.
