VOLCANIC ERUPTIONS IN THE SOUTH SEAS

500 Natives Lose Lives—Hospital Building Wiped Out—Awe-inspiring Scenery

Sydney, N. S. W., Dec. 1.—Incoming steamers bring details of the recent volcanic eruptions on the island of Ambrim, in the New Hebrides group, in which 500 natives lost their lives. Witnesses of the disturbance describe it as having been so sudden and violent that they expected to see the western side of the island disappear. With a terrific roar, which was followed by a rapid succession of artillery-like detonations, all the craters of the volcano entered into full activity, spouting flames and throwing out huge boulders. Great streams of lava began pushing down the slopes, cutting off the villagers from escape. Torrents of Lava In one instance two currents of the molten mass joined, creating an island of one section of a village. Fifty or sixty persons perished at this point. The scenes of the volcano at night were awe-inspiring. Flames shot into the air to a height of a thousand feet, illuminating the entire scene of destruction. The ocean seemed to boil, huge superheated masses of stone fell into the sea and streams of lava poured into the bay. Dust from the craters gradually formed a black cloud which blotted out the light of the stars. After the eruption the bay was filled with dead fish and large numbers of dead turtles. The water in the river was hot. The British hospital buildings were wiped out of existence, but previous to their destruction the physician removed the patients to a launch and escaped with them.
