

MUNICIPAL NOTICE

TAKE NOTICE that the Municipal Council of the City of Prince Rupert has fixed Thursday, the Fifteenth day of January, A. D. 1914, at the Council Chamber in the City Hall, Fulton Street, as the day and place for taking the vote of the ratepayers on the following bylaws:

A bylaw of the City of Prince Rupert to provide for extensions and improvements of the Municipal Telephone System of the City of Prince Rupert and to create and secure a debt for the purchase and installation of such extensions and improvements amounting to the sum of Sixty Thousand Dollars (\$60,000.00).

A bylaw to provide for the extension of the Electric Light Pole Line System of the City of Prince Rupert and to authorize the creation of a debt to the extent of Forty-five Thousand Dollars (\$45,000.00) to pay for the same and for the securing of the same with interest by the issue of debentures.

A bylaw of the City of Prince Rupert to authorize the construction of a City Building on Fulton Street for municipal purposes and for creating a debt of Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00) for the same, and to secure the said debt by the issue of debentures.

AND FURTHER TAKE NOTICE that the voting booths shall be kept open on the said Fifteenth day of January, A. D. 1914, from the hour of 9:00 a. m. until the hour of 7:00 p. m.

AND FURTHER TAKE NOTICE that F. H. C. Brown has been appointed Receiver of the City of Prince Rupert and will take charge of the said office.

A BYLAW OF THE CITY OF PRINCE RUPERT TO PROVIDE FOR EXTENSIONS AND IMPROVEMENTS OF THE MUNICIPAL TELEPHONE SYSTEM OF THE CITY OF PRINCE RUPERT AND TO CREATE AND SECURE A DEBT FOR THE PURCHASE AND INSTALLATION OF SUCH EXTENSIONS AND IMPROVEMENTS AMOUNTING TO THE SUM OF SIXTY THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$60,000.00).

WHEREAS the City of Prince Rupert at present operates an electrical system to serve the requirements of the citizens of Prince Rupert and it has become necessary to improve and extend the said system;

AND WHEREAS a petition has been duly signed by the said city requesting the Municipal Council of the City of Prince Rupert to introduce this bylaw and same has been introduced pursuant to this bylaw;

AND WHEREAS the purpose of making such improvements and extensions is to provide for the needs of the citizens of the City of Prince Rupert and to secure in manner hereafter appearing.

AND WHEREAS the assessed value of the lands and improvements in the City of Prince Rupert according to the last revised assessment roll, namely the assessment roll for the year 1913, is Twenty-eight Millions, Two Hundred and Fifteen Thousand Nine Hundred and Eighty Dollars (\$28,259,900.00);

AND WHEREAS the sum necessary for the payment of interest during the currency of the said debentures to be issued hereunder is the sum of Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00);

AND WHEREAS the sum to be set aside annually by way of sinking fund to pay the interest on the said debentures created by this bylaw is the sum of Two Thousand One Hundred and Twenty-one Dollars and Sixty-six Cents (\$2,121.66);

AND WHEREAS the sum necessary to be raised annually for the purpose of paying the said debt and interest thereon is the sum of Three Thousand Dollars (\$3,000.00);

3. For the purpose of paying for the purchase and installation of said plant the Municipal Council of the City of Prince Rupert is hereby authorized to incur a debt to the extent of One Hundred and Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$150,000.00);

4. The sum of Three Thousand Dollars (\$3,000.00) is necessary for the payment of interest during the currency of the said debentures to be issued hereunder is the sum of Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00);

5. For the purpose of paying the interest on the said sum of One Hundred and Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$150,000.00) it is necessary to raise Five Thousand Two Hundred and Fifty Dollars (\$5,250.00) each year during the currency of the said debentures, and it is further necessary to raise annually the sum of Three Thousand Seven Hundred and Twelve Dollars and Ninety Cents (\$3,712.90);

6. The said sum of Five Thousand Two Hundred and Fifty Dollars (\$5,250.00) necessary for the payment of interest during the currency of the said debentures and the sum of Three Thousand Seven Hundred and Twelve Dollars and Ninety Cents (\$3,712.90) necessary to be raised annually as a sinking fund shall be raised as follows, namely, by a special rate levied annually on all the rateable land of the City of Prince Rupert during the currency of the said debentures and shall be collected as municipal taxes and shall be placed to a separate account.

7. There shall be issued any number of debentures to be made for such sum as may be required for the raising of the said sum of One Hundred and Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$150,000.00) and such debentures may be expressed either in currency or sterling, payable in gold coin for the sum of \$100.00 in currency of £20 sterling.

8. The said debentures shall be executed and signed by the Mayor and Treasurer of the City and sealed with its corporate seal;

9. The said debentures shall bear date the Second day of January, A. D. 1914, and shall contain a promise to pay the principal of the said debentures and also the interest thereon at the rate of five per centum per annum (5%), payable half yearly, and may be with or without coupons attached thereto;

10. The said debentures shall be made payable at any place in England, the United States or Canada therein set out;

11. The amount of the debt authorized by this bylaw is subject to consolidation with the amount of any other debt in any other bylaws of the said City, passed for the purpose of raising the said sum of One Hundred and Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$150,000.00);

12. The said debentures and any coupons attached thereto shall be deemed a valid and binding charge upon the rateable land of the City of Prince Rupert and upon the said City of Prince Rupert;

13. The amount of the debt authorized by this bylaw is subject to consolidation with the amount of any other debt in any other bylaws of the said City, passed for the purpose of raising the said sum of One Hundred and Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$150,000.00);

QUARTETTE TO SPEND SIX MONTHS IN NORTH

This week saw the departure of Tim Williams, Scotty Cameron, Charlie Williams and Gus Anderson, who propose to spend the next six months trapping and prospecting at the headwaters of the Chicamen river. Their intention is to go down the canal to Glacier Bay then they will follow up the river that empties into it, to its source and cross the divide at that point. C. Williams contends that when once the summit of the range has been reached, they will not have more than five or six miles of ice to traverse before they begin the descent on the far side. They will then be in a virgin country and one which as far as known has never been trodden by the foot of a white man, and therefore a veritable paradise for men such as those who now propose to exploit it. The headwaters of the Chicamen has long since been known as a placer country judging from the alluvial gold found farther down the river and should be one of the best countries for fur bearing animals in the world.

The party took in a first class outfit and about 1400 lbs of provisions. They are all four good practical men and if they encounter no unforeseen obstacles in crossing the divide, they should have something interesting to tell on their return—Portland Canal Miner.
