The big bore is also being continued ahead to cross the fissured zone and is in over 2,860 feet.

The general manager states that the Number One vein is over 100 feet in width and was struck by the tunnel when in a distance of 2,300 feet from the portal. The Number Two vein measures a width of 40 feet, being almost solid quartz, and was encountered in a distance of 2,600 feet. Neither vein was well mineral-
