Calgary Got \$3,500,000

London, Jan. 24.—Underwriting for the new city of Calgary five per cent. loan of \$3,500,000 has been eagerly sought by many intending participants. Last night it was announced that it had been entirely underwritten at 97, and small bidders were disappointed. The loan promises to be a big success. The market continues buoyant. Underwriting is proceeding for \$1,500,000 Pacific Great Eastern 4 1/2 per cents at 95, guaranteed by the British Columbia government.

BUOY TERMINATES REMARKABLE DRIFT

Information has been received at the marine and fisheries department of an almost incredible voyage on the part of a buoy marking the entrance to the harbor at Quebec.

The gas buoy in question was placed in the fall of 1911 to mark the wreck of the old Traverse pier at the St. Lawrence port.

It was thought that the buoy, which was missing in the spring of 1912, had been carried away by the ice and sunk, but the Dominion marine department has since been advised that the buoy was picked up recently by the lightship Hellewick off the New South Wales coast.

The driftings of this buoy, could they be recorded, would probably break all records for drifts of any kind. From the Atlantic coast to New South Wales is a distance of approximately 12,000 miles.

The buoy seemed to have been caught by the currents of the North Atlantic, and carried south until it was picked up by the equatorial currents and borne to the southernmost end of the American continent, around Cape Horn, and across the Pacific to a point where it was picked up.

Its total mileage must, therefore, have been about 16,000 or 18,000 miles.

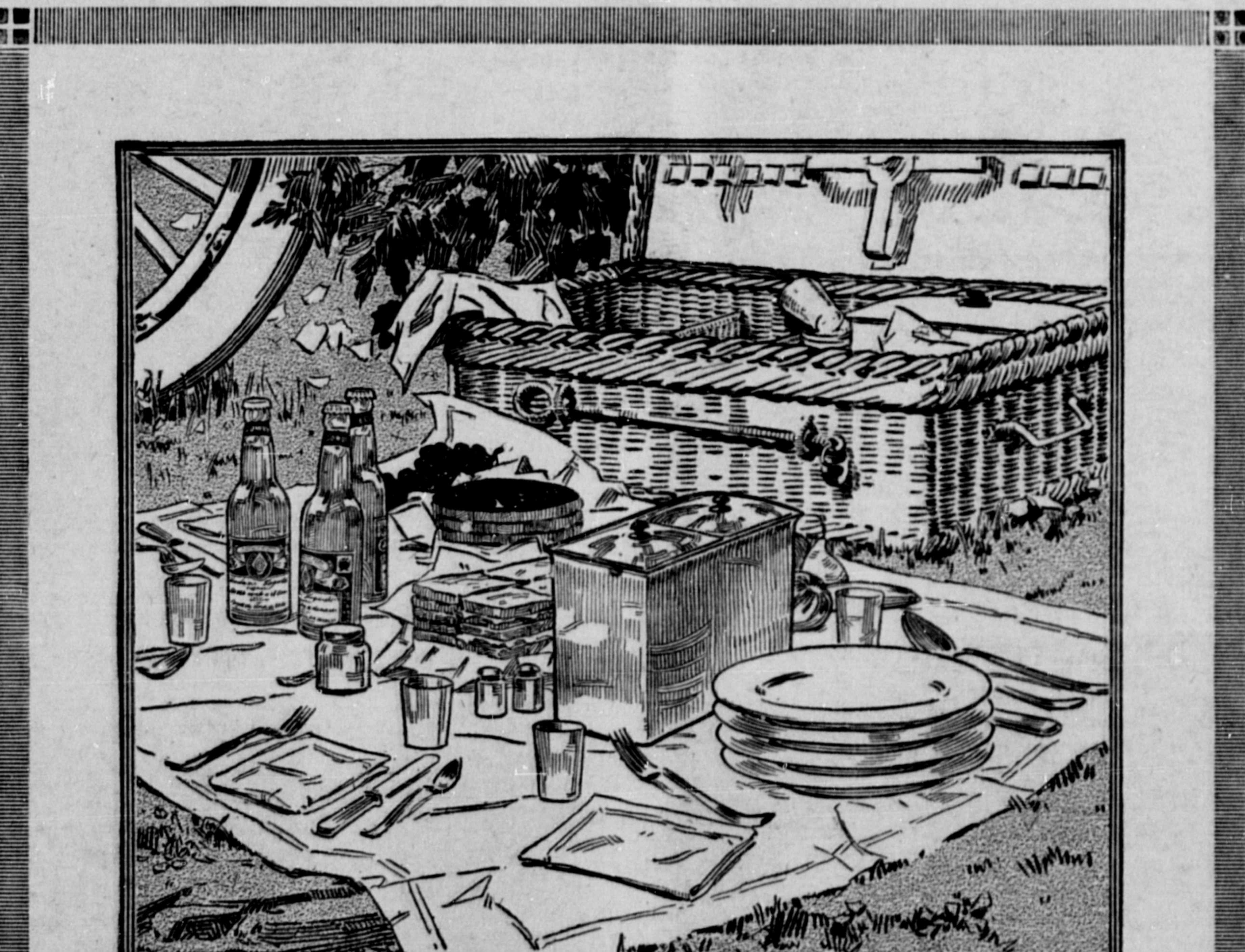
