SOUTH AMERICA GIVES **THREE MILLIONS TO FAIR**

New York, Jan. 30 .-- South American republics will contribute about \$3,000,000 to the Panama - Pacific international exposition, according to a statement made by Felix Martinez and Daniel O'Connell, United States commissioners for the exposition, appointed by President Wilson, to interest these countries in the exposition. Messrs. Martinez and O'Connell, who have just returned from their South American trip, say that they were well received everywhere.

So far the following appropriations have been made, the commissioners said: Argentine Republic, \$1,300,000; Brazil, \$650,-000; Venezuela, \$350,000; Uruguay, \$100,000. It is understood they reported that Chile will appropriate \$250,000, Peru \$250,-000, and Bolivia, \$120,000.
