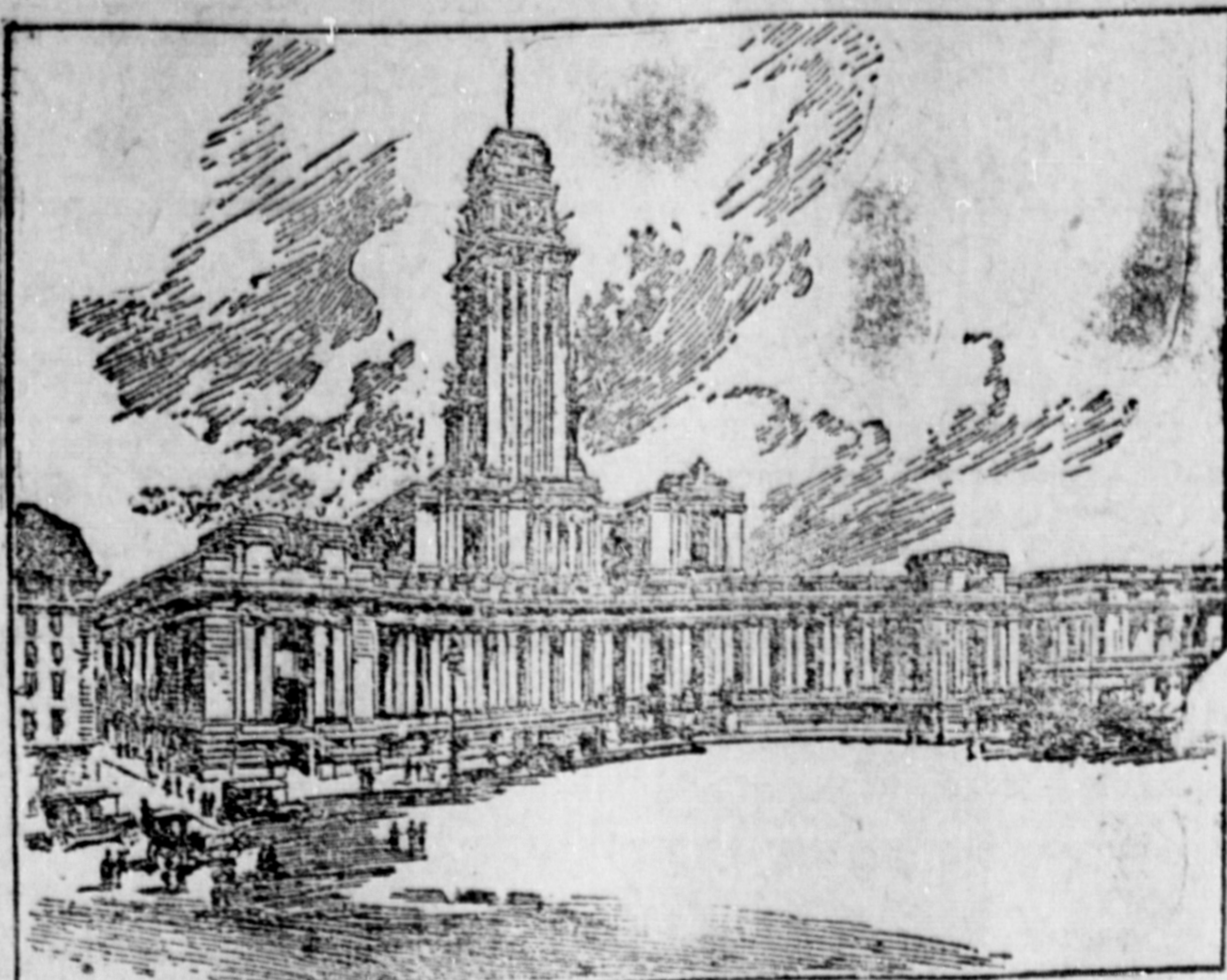

ARCHITECT'S PRELIMINARY SKETCH OF THE PROPOSED DOMINION HOUSE IN ALDWYCH

Although Lord Grey has gone, on his doctor's advice, on a holiday voyage to Australia and New Zealand, the Duke of Norfolk has consented to take his place during his absence as chairman of the board of directors of the Dominion Site (Limited), the syndicate which has obtained an option on the Aldwych site from the London county council. Lord Chelmsford and Sir Edward Ward have recently joined the board. Lord Chelmsford left England for Canada on the Olympic on Wednesday, at Lord Grey's request, in order to lay detailed plans of the scheme before Mr. Borden, prime minister of the Dominion. The scheme in its present stage has three primary objects. It will enable the governments of the self-governing Dominions and of the various states and provinces to concentrate on one central site for their offices, now widely distributed in different parts of London. It would cause the attention of the home consumer to be focussed effectively and impressively on the products of the dominions. It would give the manufacturers of the United Kingdom an opportunity of ascertaining and meeting the requirements of Greater Britain.

## NEW RAILWAY ON NAAS RIVER ATTRACTING MUCH ATTENTION

EXPECTED TO TAP COAL FIELDS AND PEACE RIVER GRANTARY—WILL MAKE TOWN ON THE NASAGO GULF—SURVEYS THIS YEAR

The new Pacific, Peace River & Athabasca railway, which is seeking a charter at Ottawa, is attracting much attention in the west. Surveyors will go into the field in March or early in April, and construction work will be begun some time in the spring of 1915.

The line has been laid out with a view of draining the magnificent Groundhog coal basin, in which Mr. Thomas and his associates have secured large interests. The line will also tap the coal fields along the Peace river, will pass through the Omineca mining country and it aims to make a bid for the transportation of wheat by its sections through Alberta and Saskatchewan.

At Prince Albert, Sask., the Pacific, Peace River & Athabasca railway will secure connection with the big Canadian transcontinental and connections with the railway systems of America. It will also be in a position to enter the Hudson bay district through the pass.

The promoters plan to build the road from Nasago gulf, in the Portland canal, and very near the mouth of the Naas river. From that point the line will cross British Columbia and will go through the mountains by Hogen pass. The grade there is said to be .91 per cent, about the best mountain grade obtainable. Hogen pass is about 375 miles northwest of the Yellowhead pass, through which the G. T. P. and C. N. R. enter British Columbia.

Except for sections along the Naas river, where it approaches as close as twenty miles to the main line of the G. T. P., the P. R. & A. will open up a territory that is hundreds of miles away from the nearest railway at the present time.

David Alfred Thomas, 122 Ashley Gardens, S. W., London, England, is the leading figure in the promotion of the line. He has acquired extensive coal areas by purchase or by option, and is said to be interested in other mineral lands in northern British Columbia. He is one of the most wealthy coal barons in the world and the annual output of coal from his Welsh mines exceeds by 5,000,000 tons the annual output of coal from Canadian coal mines.

From Nasago bay or the mouth of the Naas, the line will run northeast up the Naas for a distance of 225 miles to the height of land between the Naas and the Skeena watershed, then down Courier creek to the Skeena and down the Skeena to the mouth of Bear river, and up the Bear river to Bear lake and then across the divide in a southerly direction to Driftwood river and down the Driftwood river to North Tacla lake and from that lake to Hogen pass.

After leaving the pass, the line will go to the Omineca river, thence easterly to the Findlay branch of the Peace river and then down the north side of the main Peace river and easterly and northerly to Vermilion rapids or chutes in the province of Alberta. Thence crossing the Peace river at the falls or chutes and continuing down the right bank of the Peace river, the railway goes to Point Providence, thence in an easterly direction to the mouth of the Athabasca river, then up the Athabasca to Fort McMurray, in an easterly direction to the Clearwater river, thence to the Pembina river and thence south to the height of land and crossing over the Buffalo river, the line goes easterly and southerly to Prince Albert in

Saskatchewan, completing the distance of 1500 miles.

London, Feb. 23.—Interviewed at Cardiff, Wales, Mr. David Thomas, the big Welsh colliery proprietor, who is backing the bill before the Canadian parliament for a charter to the Pacific, Peace River & Athabasca railway company to construct a new railway in the Peace river district, admitted that he was interested in such a scheme, but said that the reported length of the railway, viz., 1500 miles, was greatly exaggerated.

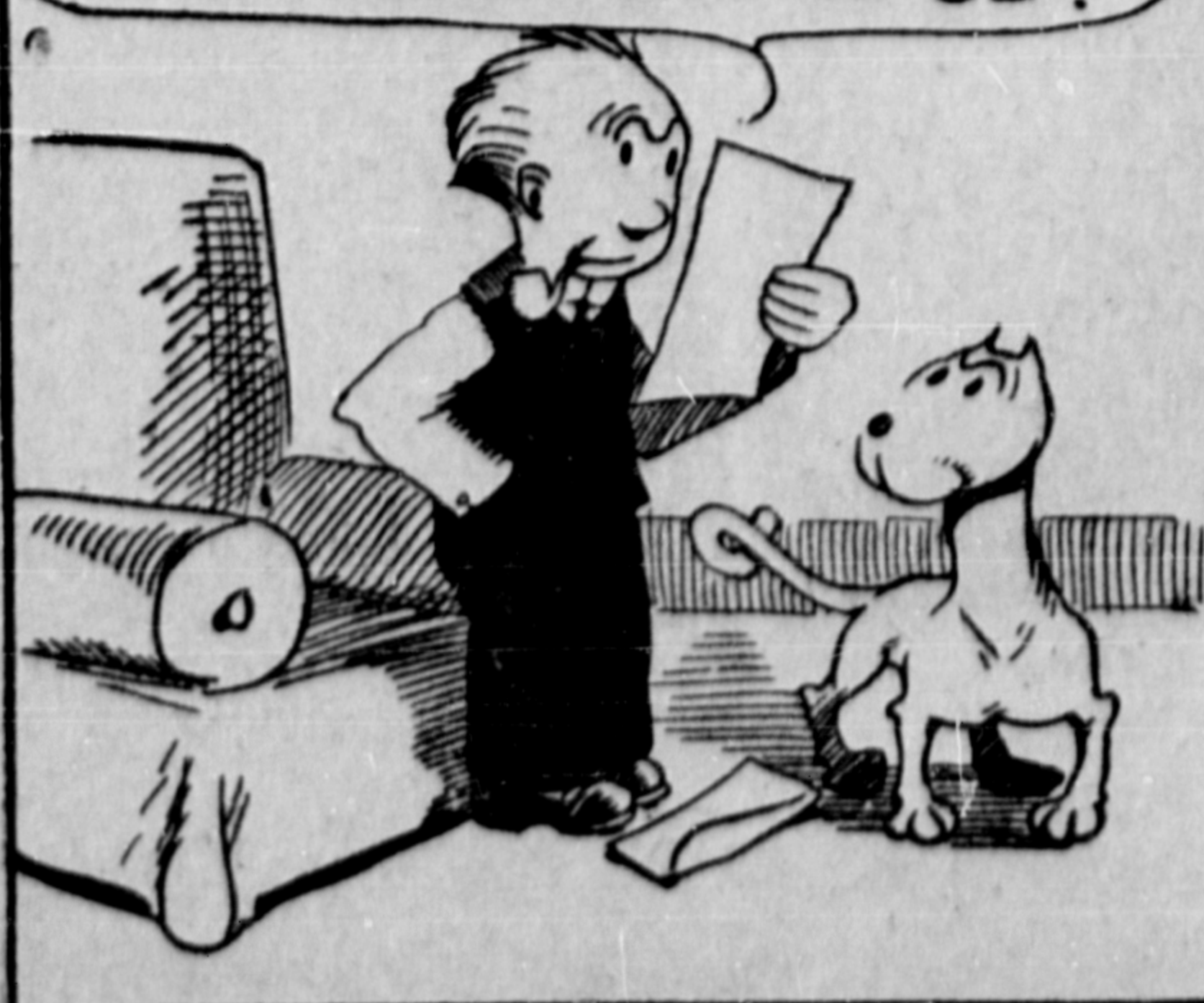
