In a basketball game played last evening between teams representing the Aberdonians and Midlothians, which was conspicuous more for rough play than any exhibition of basketball, the latter were victorious by a score of 22 to 14. At half time the score was 8-6 in favor of the High school. It was a fast game and the checking on both sides was a great improvement on the last game. Dennis, and Campbell. J. Campbell of the Callies was easily the best man on the floor and played a sterling game.

Negotiations have been opened by Aberdeen, Wash., citizens looking to the purchase of the Victoria Northwestern league baseball franchise and the placing of an Aberdeen team in the league. About \$4,000 has been subscribed toward a proposed \$10,000 stock company to finance the deal in case negotiations succeed.

A rule barring any man over 40 years of age from engaging in a public boxing match in this state has been issued by the New York boxing commission. The rule supplements the previous rule that contestants must not be less than 18 years old. Secretary Dave Gilerist of the British Columbia Lacrosse association has called the annual

meeting for Thursday next, Mar. 26, in New Westminster. Delegates from Vancouver, Victoria and New Westminster will be in attendance.

Despite the claims of the Toronto lacrosse club that it had secured a number of Westminister stars, the Victoria club has stolen march on the eastern teams and has signed four members of the royal city twelve. Doughy Spring, the sensational home fielder has wired accepting terms offered and he will be brought here at once. Hughie Gifford, Len Turnbull and Johnny Howard have also accepted terms, all but Howard signing contracts to play with the Victoria club this summer.

Charlie Querrie, the well known Toronto lacrosse player, will again manage the Tecumsehs and announces that he will take another whirl at the game. Querrie is one of the few veterans left in the game down east.

Thirty thousand dollars a year is the salary received by John J. McGraw as manager of the New York Giants, according to an affidavit signed by McGraw here in accordance with the income tax law. His contract signed last winter has four more years to run.

Georges Carpenter, who was 20 years old on January 12, earned 50 centimes (10 cents) a day as a pit boy six years ago. Since then he has won stakes a total of 431,220 francs (\$86,244). In 1909 he won 920 francs (\$184); in 1910, 2,300 francs (\$460); in 1911, 33,000 francs (\$6,600); in 1912 175,000 francs (\$35,000), and in 1913, 220,000 francs (\$44,000). It is not likely that Carpenter will be able to postpone his military service for more than another year. Then he will have to spend three years in the army, after which he will probably be unfit for boxing, hence he intends to make the most of the time he has left.



## PLATINUM MINING TO BE DEMONSTRATED

Nelson, B. C., March 24.—Convinced as the result of two years' experiment during which scores of assays have been made and other work carried on at an expense of \$5,000, a local syndicate has arranged to build a plant with a capacity of one ton per day to demonstrate the possibilities of platinum existing here. A London metallurgist has been working on the experiments and supervising the erection of the plant.
