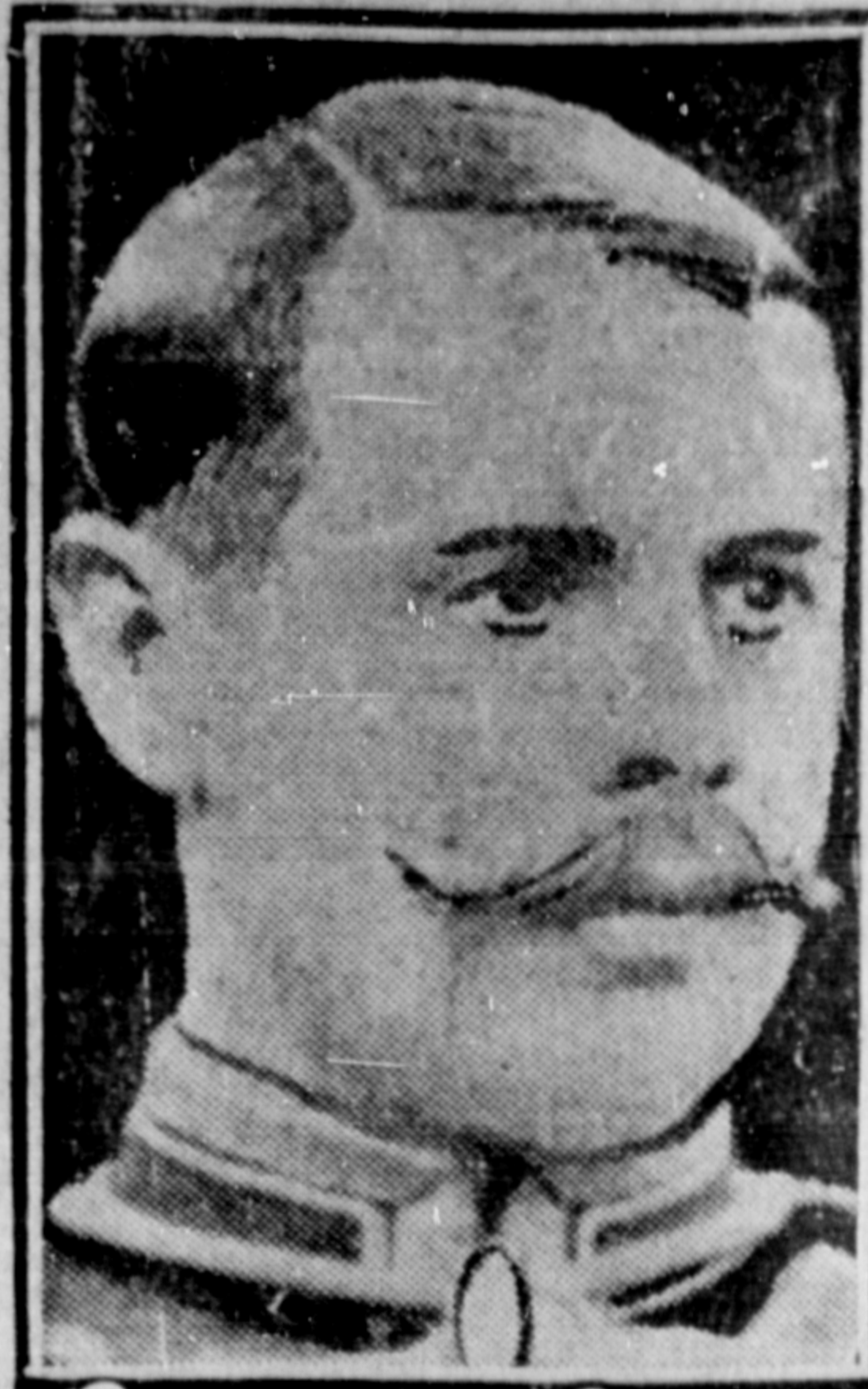

CANADIAN FRATERNITY ORGANIZED IN CITY

Development of New Idea for Welcoming Canadians Who Come to Rupert

The Canadian Fraternity is the name of a new society organized by a few local citizens. The meeting was held in the court house on Monday evening, when quite a number were present. The object of the organization is purely fraternal. The hand of good fellow ship is to be extended to all Canadians who visit Prince Rupert. If a Canadian enters Prince Rupert as a stranger the Canadian Fraternity will welcome him and assist him to establish citizenship here. The Canadian Fraternity wants all Canadians to make it their own particular society. With this object and the good spirit back of it it is expected the movement will spread to other Canadian cities.

J. R. Beatty officiated as chairman of the organization meeting. The officers elected were: Hon. pres., Dr. Westbrook, head of the British Columbia university; president, Rev. Canon Rix; vice-president, C. W. Peck; secretary, Leo Waugh; executive, R. O'Neill, J. D. McLeod, M. M. Stephens, and Kenneth Munro. A committee composed of Judge Young, J. R. Beatty and Rev. Canon Rix are drafting by-laws.



MILITANT'S SHRIEKS FILLED COURTROOM

London, April 8.—"General" Mrs. Flora Drummond, the militant suffragette, shrieked so loudly when arraigned today at the police court in connection with the suffragette disturbance at Hyde park on Sunday that she had to be forcibly removed. She would not allow either the magistrate or the prosecutor to utter an audible word.

When Mrs. Drummond entered the prisoners' enclosure, she shouted at the top of her voice that she wouldn't permit anyone but herself to speak, because, she said, the magistrates and the police courts were doing the dirty work of Premier Asquith. She then proceeded to bombard the court with volleys of verbal shrapnel until she was carried out by wardens.

THREATENS TO NAIL BISHOP TO CROSS

Mexico City, April 8.—Zapata, the rebel chieftain, has captured the Bishop of Chalapa in Guerrero, and is holding him in close confinement. He threatens that unless the prelate pays him 50,000 pesos he will celebrate the Passion Play in earnest on Good Friday with the bishop as the protagonist. Zapata declares that he will surely crucify the bishop on that day unless the money is forthcoming.

Sale of Baseball Players

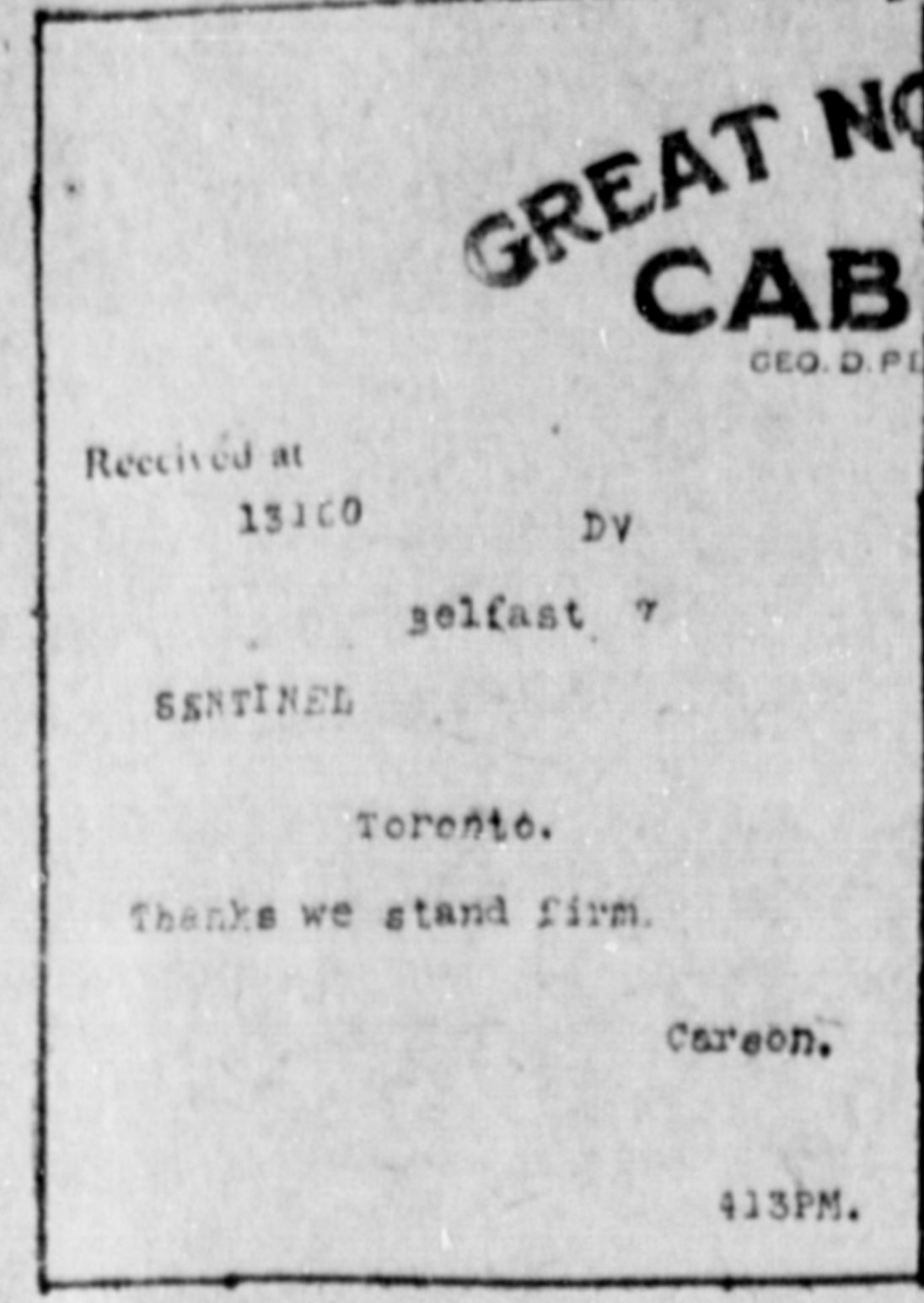
