BRITISH COLUMBIA FISHERIES INVESTIGATION WAS FARFICAL

TORONTO SATURDAY NIGHT ON THE REPORT OF ENQUIRY INTO SIR GEORGE DOUGHTY'S ADVENTURE IN BRITISH COLUMBIA FISHING As the outcome of the appointment of a committee of enquiry, the shareholders of the British Columbia Fisheries, Ltd., are being asked to put more money into that ill-starred concern, which in a little more than eighteen months after its promotion by Sir George Doughty, M. P., and his son, Mr. Wilfred V. Doughty, passed into the hands of a receiver for the debenture holders, in whose possession it still remains. It appears that the committee made their so-called enquiry and drew up a report within five weeks of their appointment, and that this report was adopted at a meeting of shareholders convened by the directors before Christmas at only two clear days' notice. Publicity was successfully avoided until the Financial Times brought the facts to light on Monday. The committee's enquiry was transparently farfical, inasmuch as it was restricted entirely to what could be ascertained from the directors and the secretary in London. It is in British Columbia that much of the capital has been squandered, and it was there, of course, that investigation both with regard to the past expenditure and the future prospects of the undertaking was most necessary. The committee remark that the expenditure has been lavish, but a more forcible adjective than that could be just applied to it if the statements of local critics are correct, and the committee's opinion that "with good management a good business can be established" would be more convincing if it were backed up by independent experts acquainted with the company's properties and the fisheries.
