Out of a 25 cent shave my portion is 10 cents and out of that I must pay rent, laundry, business, license, water for bath and barber shop, and what is left is nothing more than a fair wage.

I have been nineteen years in the British empire and have been for a number of years a citizen and voter of Canada. I am also a man of family. I have always been a believer in a high standard of living and before I would undercut my competitors I would quit the business.

Mr. Morrissey says the only equal of Mr. St. Louis as a barber is Brother Moody. Why then does he not patronize the higher priced shop? Is it that he insists on cutting labor and saving 10 cents.

Mr. Morrissey was wrong when he accused the Daily News of calling the patrons of Mr. St. Louis as "bums." This was said by a witness in court and reported by the Daily News verbatim. In conclusion I would say that I had Mr. St. Louis in my employ for a few hours and had to fire him because my patrons would not stand for him.

I would be glad to put up \$100 against an equal amount that my work is superior to that of Mr. St. Louis, and this is a chance for Mr. Morrissey to get a free shave. If Mr. Morrissey will arrange to get all the local prices equal to Vancouver's I will gladly correspond.
