The city council passed five more local improvement bylaws last evening. There are now eleven of them awaiting the court of revision.

The steamer McArthur, of the United States hydrographic survey, anchored in the harbor last night. She is northbound for work in Alaska.

A petition has been presented to the city council for a 16-foot plank road on Summit avenue from lot 44 to lot 56. A bylaw will be prepared.

The city council passed a resolution last evening ordering the city auditor, P. Robertson, to complete the audit of 1913 by May 4, and that his services then be dispensed with.

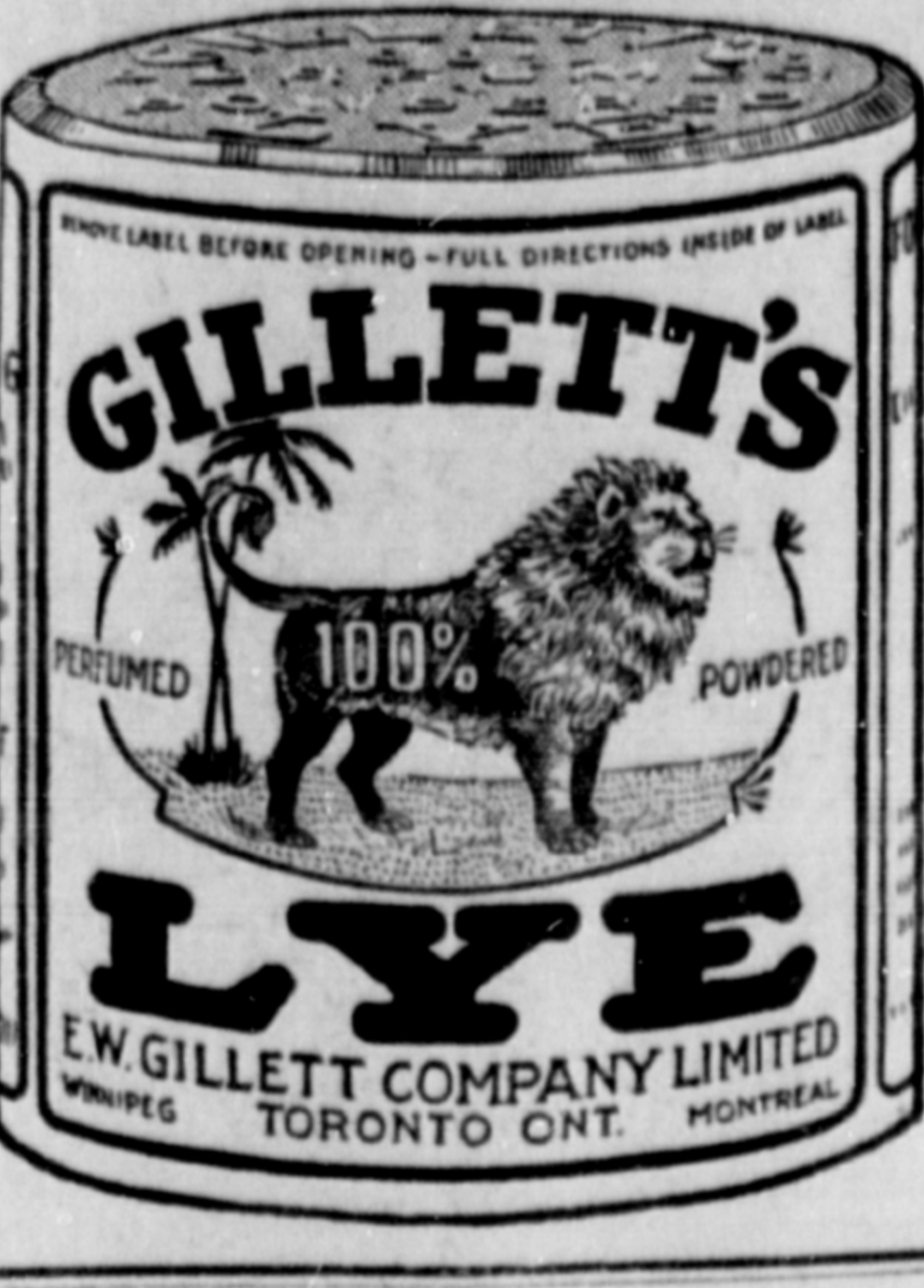
Pete Sigurdson, the wrestler, is having his halibut boat fixed up by Akerman & Thompson. Pete will be ready to go out on the banks in a few days.

#### On a Long Tramp

There arrived in Smithers the other day a man who has achieved quite a reputation as a musher—Ed. N. Clark, representing Pearson's Magazine, who is on the last lap of a tramp from Spokane to Prince Rupert. Leaving Spokane on February 18, he travelled on foot through the Boundary and Kootenay districts and up to Fort George, from whence he followed the G. T. P. to Smithers, leaving here yesterday for the coast, which he must reach within nine days to win his bet of \$500 with Captain Larson. Mr. Clark and a companion, in the winter of 1908-9, accomplished the feat of tramping across Canada, from Quebec to Vancouver, a distance of 3,351 miles, making the trip in 118 days. The doctory musher, under the terms of his wager, started on his present trip without a cent of money.—Smithers Review.

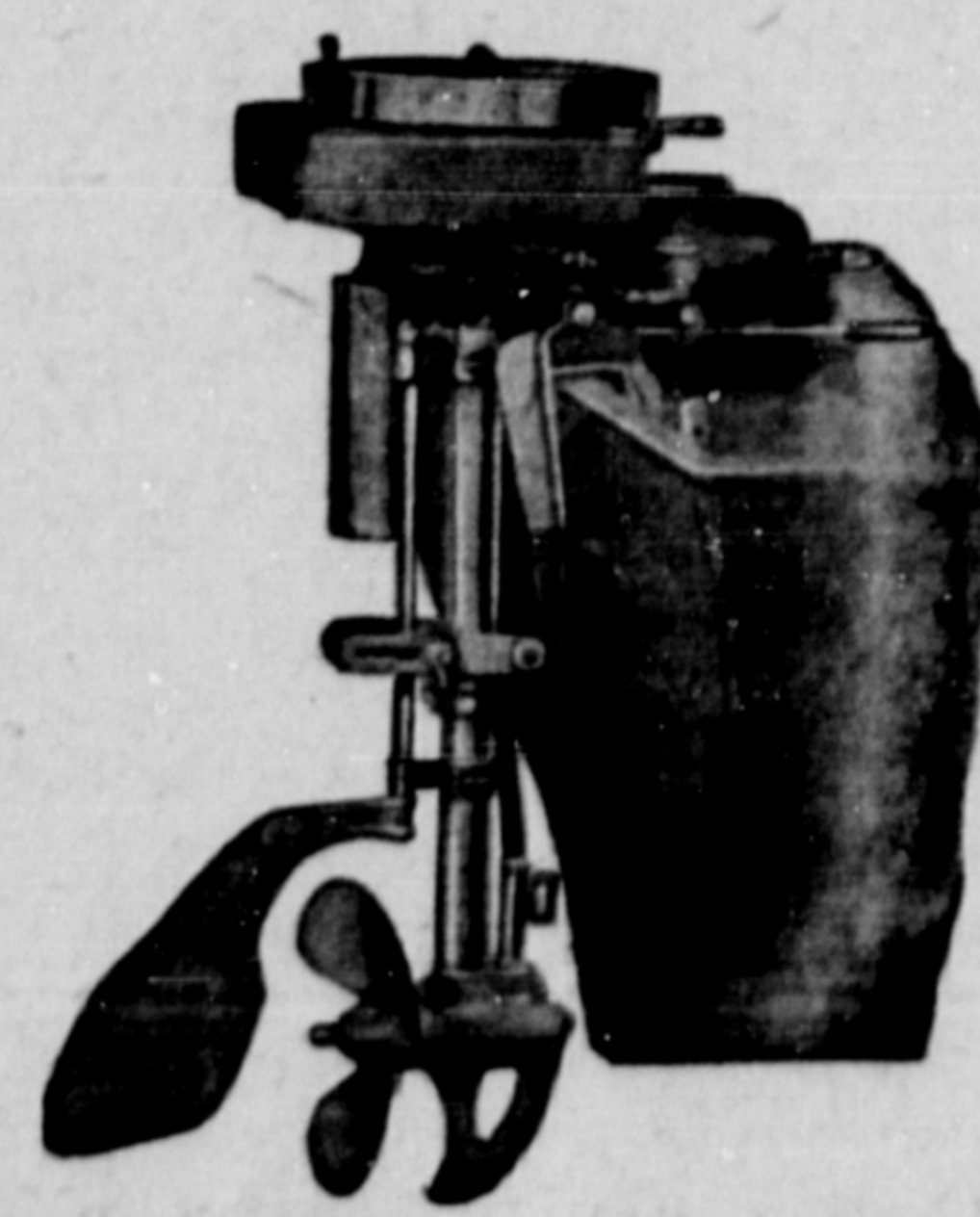
