Logs for Japan

Consigned to a firm at Yokohama, a great many huge logs are being loaded on to the Blue Funnel freighter Cyclops at Seattle. Fifty-four of these big fir logs, some of them nearly ten feet in diameter, and averaging in weight thirty tons apiece, are being swung aboard. The Japanese, it seems, prefer to buy the logs instead of the sawed lumber, as they can utilize much of the slabs and bark that would be wasted if the logs were sawed on this side.

Took Over G. T. P. Stock

Great interest has been manifested in the London stock market by the actions of a "rescue syndicate" which took over a block of Grand Trunk stock. The syndicate, it is understood, includes representatives of the Bank of England, the Bank of Montreal and the Messrs. Robert Flemings. The block of Grand Trunks ordinary taken over is now estimated at \$15,000,000 par value. There is much curiosity for the reason for such a big accumulation, but it is believed to have been for American interests.
