

## Royal Standard Date Cookies

Recipe No. 11—Cut out and paste in your Recipe Book.

Two cups ROYAL STANDARD, 2 cups ROYAL STANDARD rolled oats, 1 cup brown sugar, 1/2 card lard, 3/4 cups sour milk, 1 teaspoonful salt, 1/4 cup butter, 1 teaspoonful baking soda, 1 package dates. Melt the shortening. Add brown sugar, rolled oats, flour and salt. Put teaspoonful soda into the sour milk and mix all together. Stone one package of dates, add a little water and then put on stove for about 15 minutes, add about half cup sugar. Roll dough thin and cut into rounds with a glass. Bake for about 15 minutes. Place date in centre.
