

Royal Standard Date Cookies

Recipe No. 11.—Cut out and paste in your Recipe Book.

Two cups ROYAL STANDARD rolled oats; 1 cup brown sugar; 3/4 cup lard; 3/4 cups sour milk; 1 tea-spoonful salt; 1/2 cup butter; 1 tea-spoonful baking soda; 1 package dates. Melt the shortening. Add brown sugar, rolled oats, flour and salt. Put tea-spoonful soda into the sour milk and mix all together. Stone one package of dates, add a little water and then put on stove for about 15 minutes, add about half cup sugar. Roll dough thin and cut into rounds with a glass. Bake for about 15 minutes. Place date in centre.
