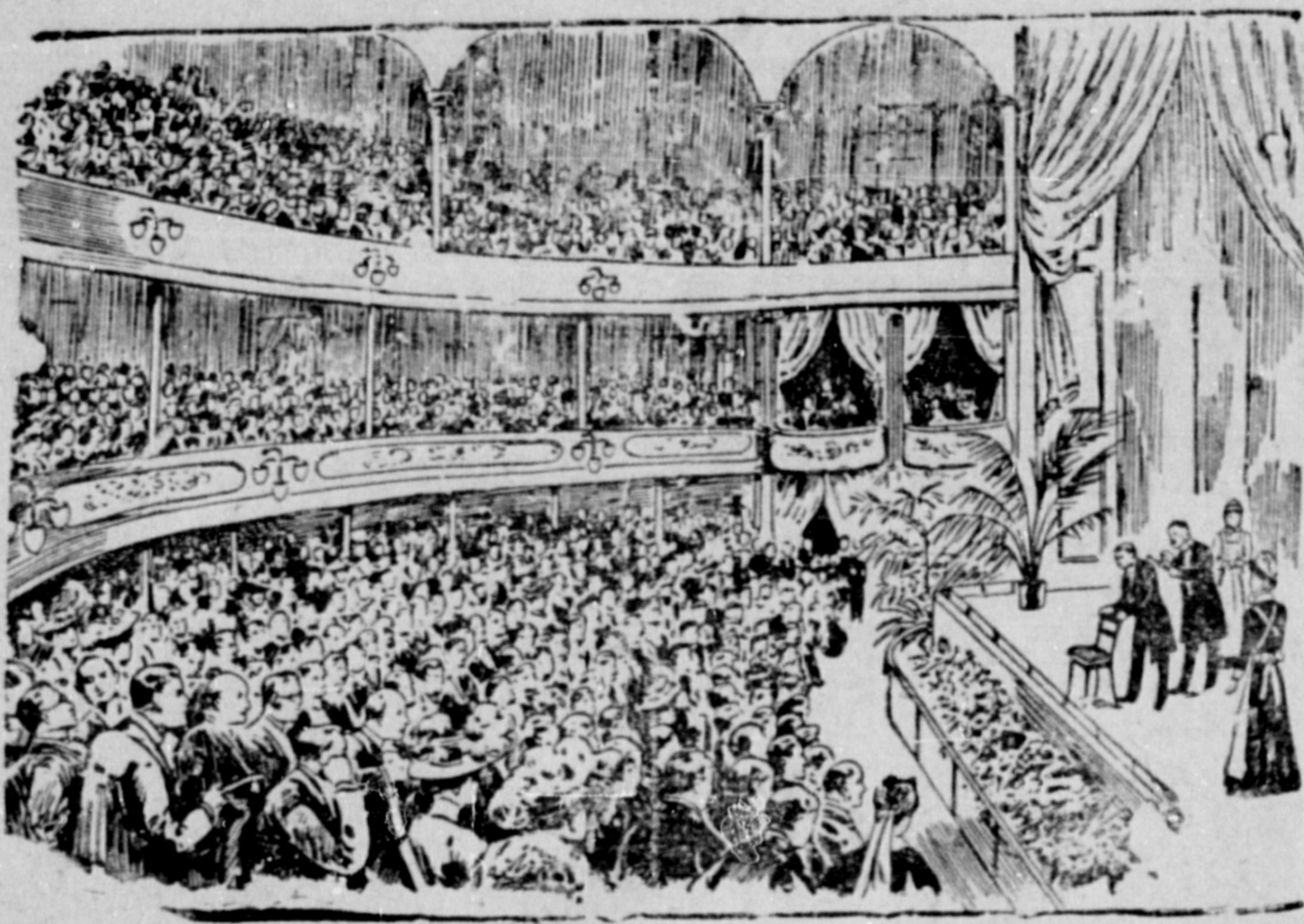

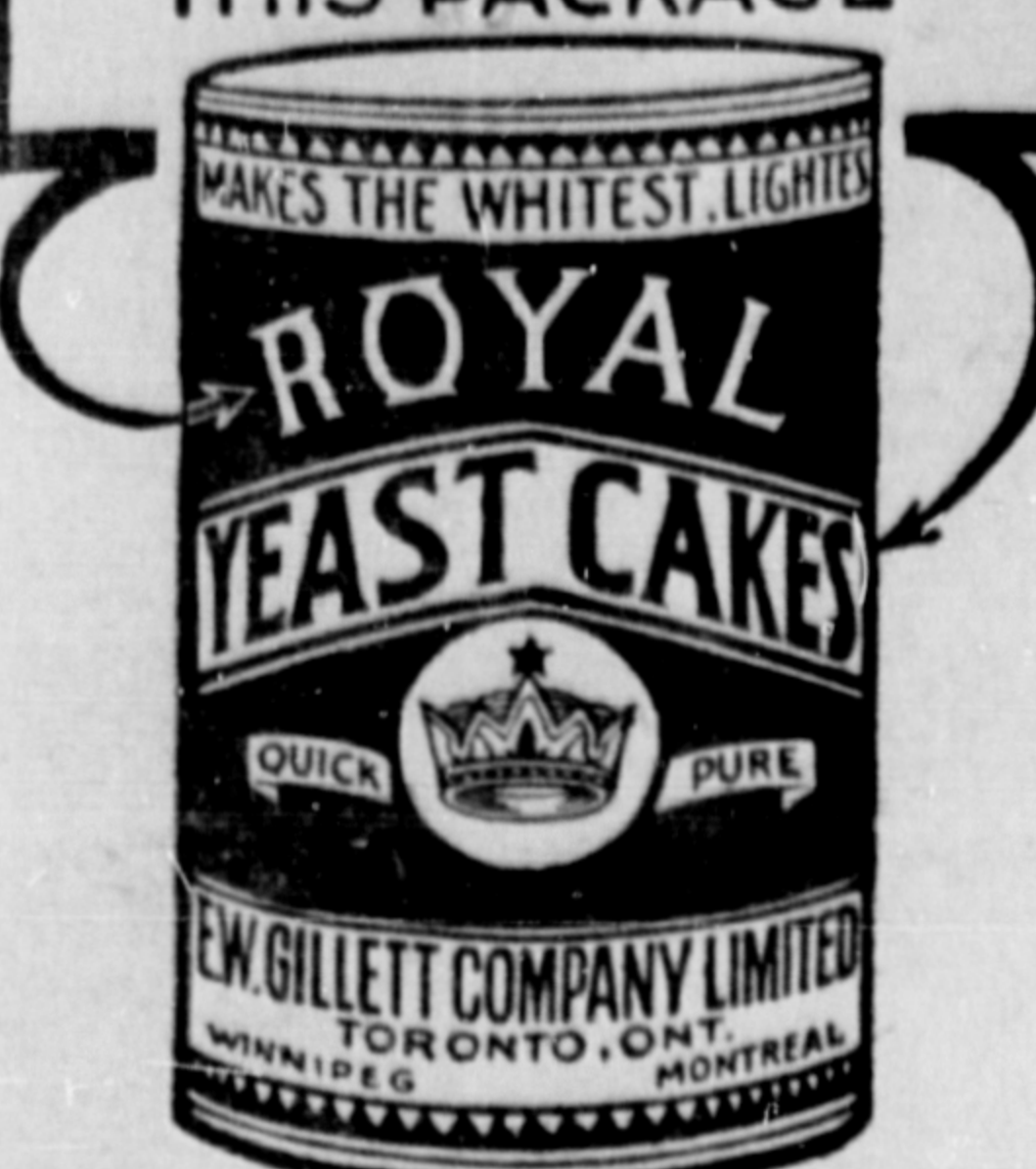

The Prince Rupert Licensed Vintners' association has decided to put up a silver cup for the City ball league. The cup will be on exhibition in Cole's window this afternoon. It will be presented to the pennant winner of the league, and any team winning it three years may retain it.
