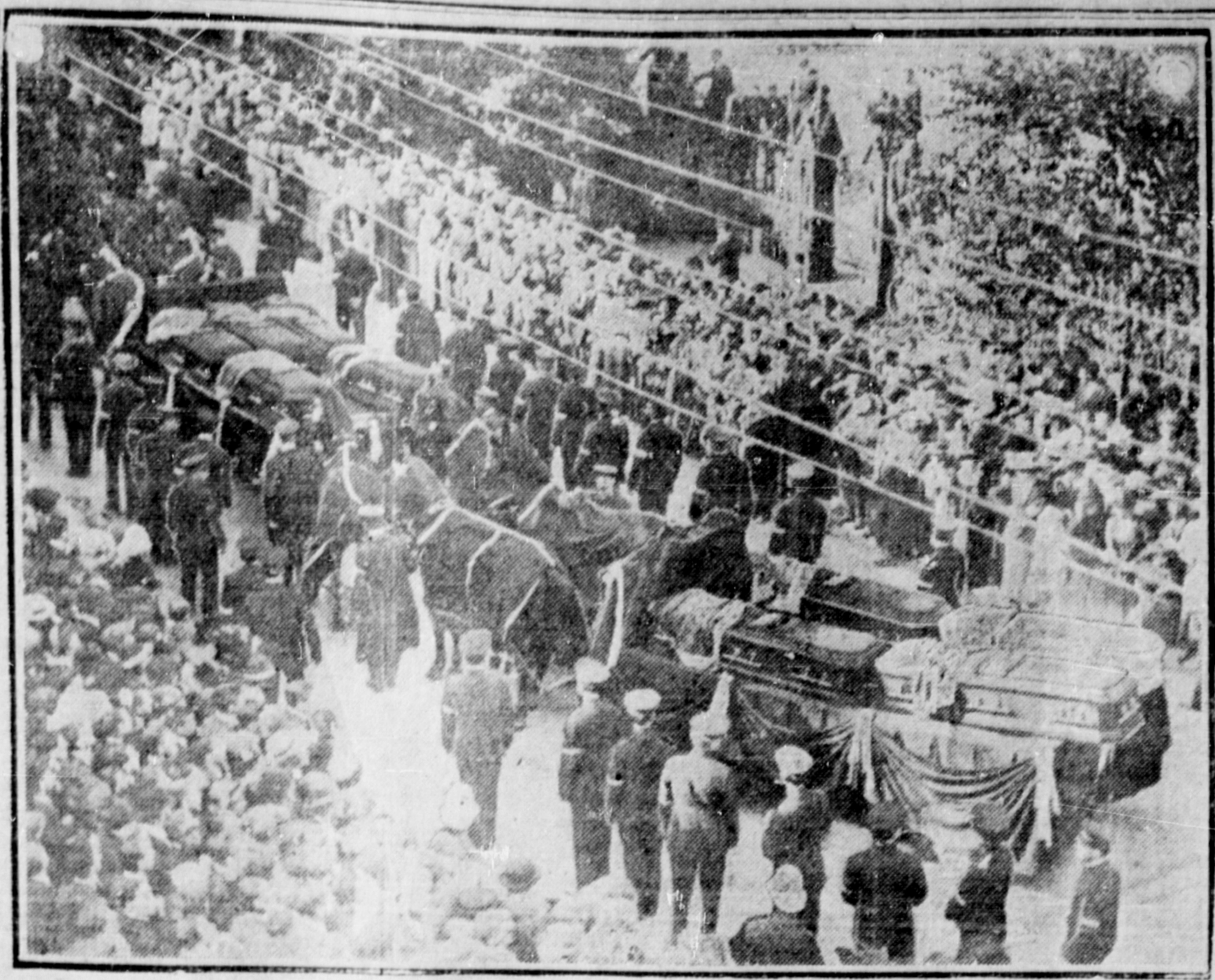

PASSING EVENTS

With their families and themselves on the verge of starvation the men of the building trades in London have again by large majority rejected the terms offered by the masters, and threaten a national strike, which, however, is not likely to materialize owing to the objection of the provincial unions to countenance their demand.

A son of Senor Maura, a former Premier of Spain, was so incensed on hearing Rodrigo Soliano, a radical deputy in the Cortes, call his father during the debate a coward, that he attacked him later with his cane and fists and made his nose bleed profusely.

The "no-drink before ten" law went into effect in Scotland on May 28th, and is to be rigorously enforced. The act is aimed at the open air workers in the shipyards, who are addicted to before breakfast drinking which not only injures their health, but leads to excessive drinking at other hours.

The Liberal members of the Senate and the House of Commons on May 28th presented Sir Wilfrid Laurier with a gold watch and Lady Laurier with a purse of gold on the occasion of the completion of forty years' service in Parliament by the Opposition leader.

Among the guests entertained at a garden party in Toronto last week by H. R. H. the Duke of Connaught were the Mexican envoys now attending the mediation conference at Niagara Falls, Ont.

H. R. H. Prince Alexander of Teck, the Governor-General of Canada designate, was given a dinner by the Canadian Club in London on May 28th, at which many leading Canadians and others were present. In concluding his address acknowledging the honor done him the Prince said it was his earnest wish to help in forwarding happiness and prosperity in Canada.

The Dominion Government has decided to build the railroad connecting Montreal with the National Transcontinental Railway.

The Right Rev. Charles Scadding, bishop of Oregon and a son of the late Henry Scadding, of Toronto, died in Portland, Ore., on May 27th after a few days illness from pleuro-pneumonia, aged 53 years.

Sir Joseph Swan, the eminent inventor, especially of the incandescent lamp which bears his name, as well as many new processes connected with photography, died in London on May 27, aged 86 years.

Mr. John Burns, President of the British Board of Trade, has drawn up a merchants' shipping bill for safety at sea which will be introduced in Parliament shortly. It provides, among other things, for a new wireless danger signal, T T T, which is to be repeated ten times at full power. This signal will warn vessels of imminent danger from icebergs, cyclones, etc. The T T T will not supersede the present S O S. Other urgent signals are provided for, such as "You are standing into danger." "I want

Stratheona, which was probated in London on May 27th, shows a personal estate of a total value of \$23,254,510, of which \$21,161,745 was in holdings abroad and \$2,092,765 was in Great Britain. The British Exchequer will benefit to the extent of \$4,189,490 through the payment of death duties. The deceased's household effects in Grosvenor Square are valued at \$131,780. The pictures there are worth \$84,140. Had the will come under the budget just introduced in Parliament the death duties would have amounted to \$5,585,585.

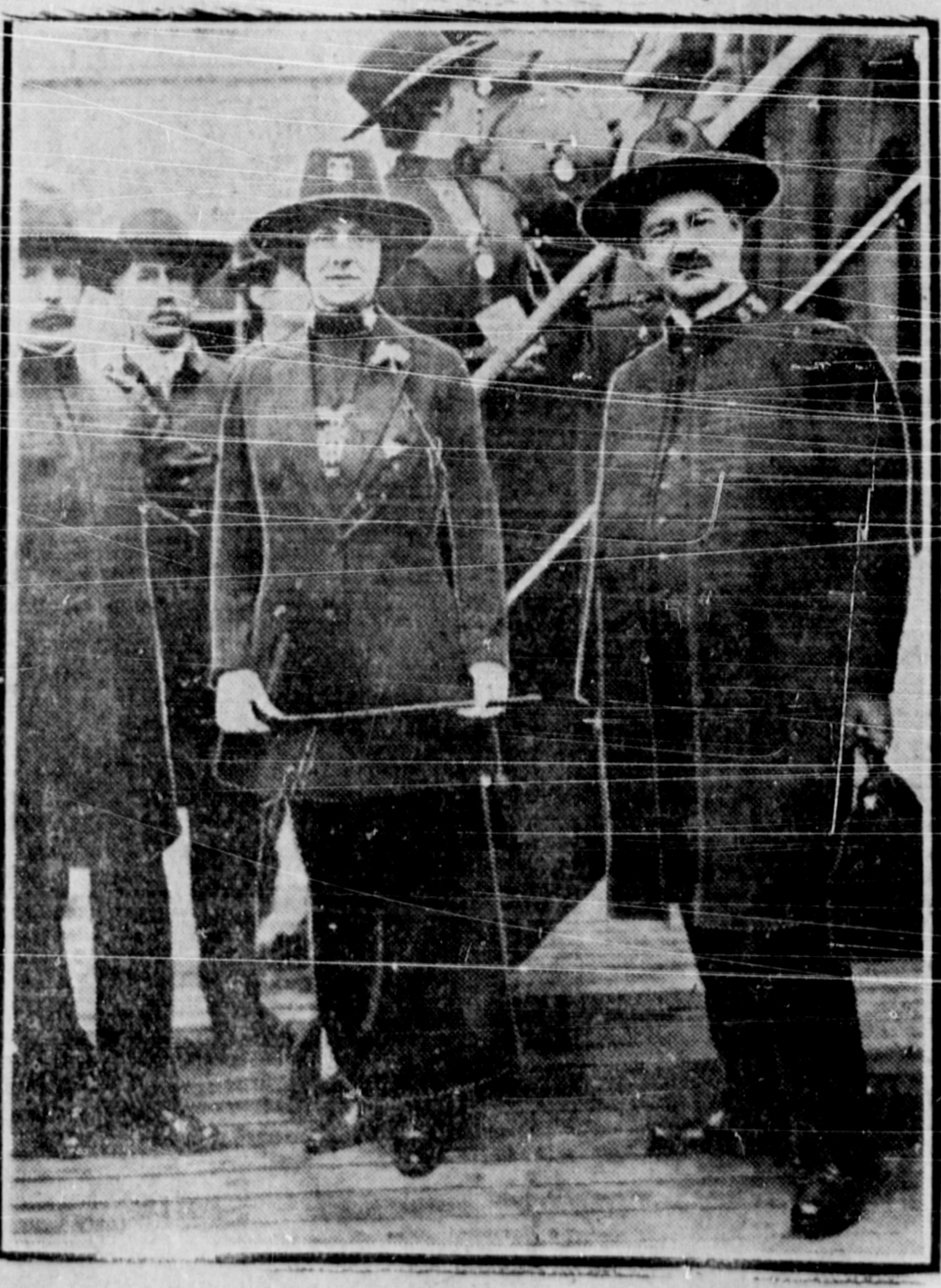

VETERAN NORTHERN MASTER FOR ALICE

Capt. J. McLeod Leaves Princess May to Take Alice on the Alaska Run

When the C. P. R. steamer Princess Alice enters the Northern trade she will be commanded by the veteran Alaskan navigator, Capt. John McLeod, who has piloted steamers up and down the coast for a great many years. For two months during the summer Capt. McLeod will occupy the master's berth of the palatial boat, and his command, the Princess May, will in all probability, go to Capt. Jeremiah Shaw, who is at present skipper of the Princess Mary. Capt. Brown, now on the Princess Alice, will pilot the Princess Mary on the night run between Victoria and Vancouver.

Capt. McLeod is an undisputed authority on Alaska navigation. He has been in the service so long that he has thoroughly familiarized himself with the courses and weather between here and Skagway. Capt. McLeod is one of the senior masters of the C. P. R. service. His splendid judgment and accuracy in details have resulted in his having been involved in very few mishaps.

Capt. McLeod is one of the best known of the Nova Scotian colony now residing here. He was formerly a sealing master and doubled Cape Horn in the schooner Ariel. Capt. McLeod sailed from Halifax in 1892 and succeeded in making the run out with the Ariel in 128 days, which was one of the smartest passages ever made by any of the schooners which came out from the East. Capt. McLeod took the Ariel on several sealing cruises and he commanded some of the other schooners of the famous fleet.

Commencing on June 26th the Princess Alice will start out on the first of her four tourist excursions to Alaska. Capt. McLeod will remain with the Alice until she is through with the northern trade.

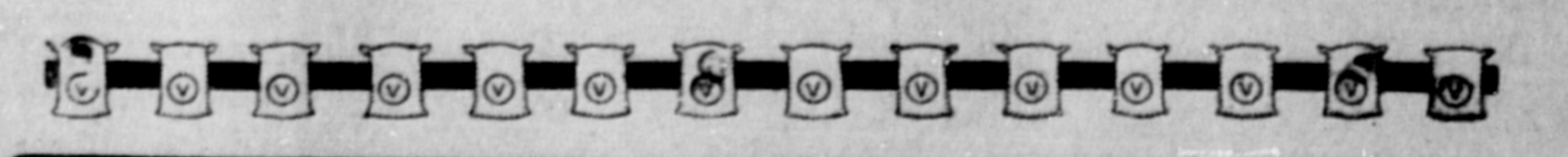
