THE MUMMY OF A SORCERESS

Facts Regarding the Terrible Un-printed Occult Story, the Telling of Which is Blamed for the Titanic Catastrophe.

An expert occultist, who has penetrated deep into the mysteries of the unknown beyond, has enunciated the theory that the mummy's evil influence is less pronounced toward those who approach her with the spirit of reverence, but to all who look upon her desecrated coffin with the spirit of curiosity the consequences are never anything but terribly dangerous. The writer of this rough outline has reason to know that death, tragic and terrible, has visited one of his own intimate relatives who visited the mummy when warned against so doing.
