

BRITISH M.P. RESIGNS WITH CURSES AGAINST THE GOVT. FOR NOT ACTING IN STRIKE

London, July 24—Cursing the government's refusal to intervene in the dock strike here, in which more than 250,000 men, women and children are suffering privation, James O'Grady left his seat in the House of Commons, swearing that he would not retain his place in that body while women and children starved.

O'Grady demanded that Premier Asquith intervene in the strike. Asquith said it was impossible. O'Grady then shouted "This is a damned scandal," and left the chamber at once.

London, July 24—The tenth week of the strike of the dockworkers ended today with no settlement in sight. About 60,000 men are out, and their wives and children, numbering about 250,000 are living on charity.

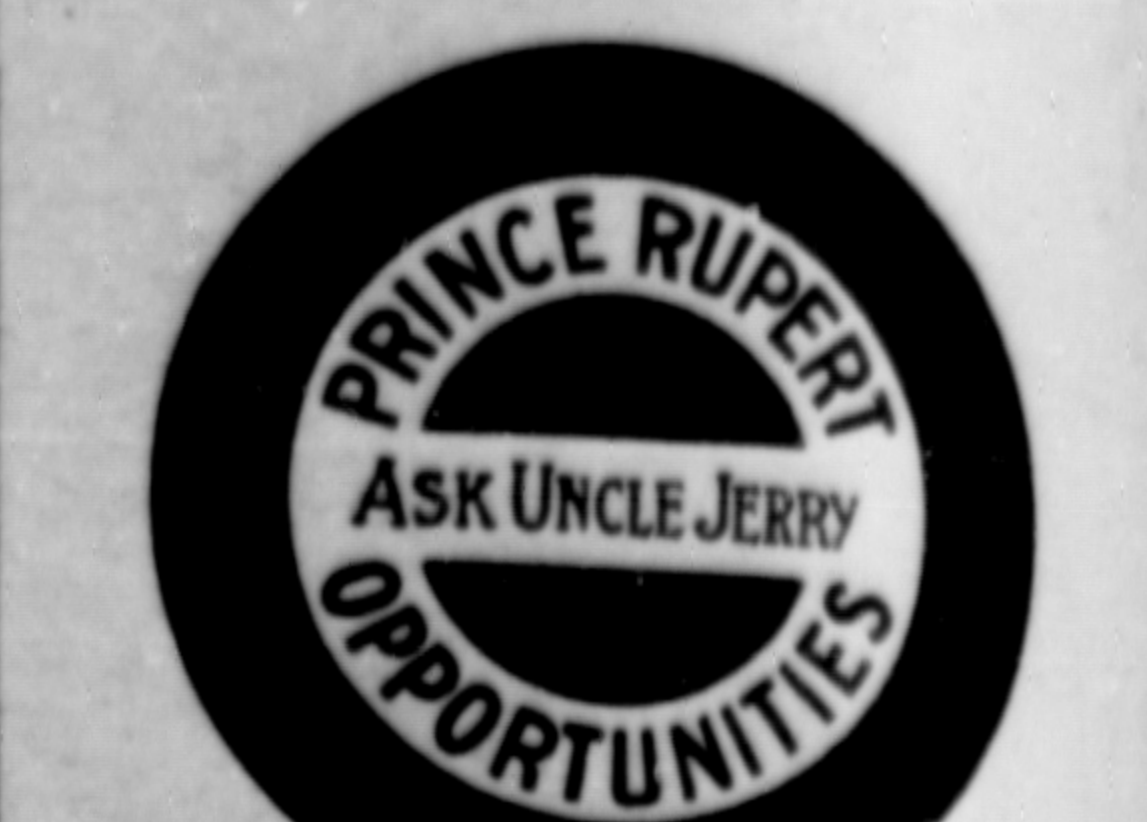
