The official program of the Labor Day sports to be held under the auspices of the Prince Rupert Trades and Labor Council shows that \$600 will be given away in prizes during the course of the day for the various events staged for the celebration. With excellent weather in view an early start will be made with the water-front sports and no one will want to remain in bed that morning when they know that the fishermen are going to give a first hand demonstration of how they get their catches, in the form of a race. The announcement of the surf riding exhibition has interested many and this event will be the closing one in the forenoon, following the canoe race.

Promptly at 4 p.m. the excitement of the day is again precipitated by a baseball match between the Tigers and the Red Sox. After the jumping and putting the shot which occurs immediately after the ball twirlers have completed their act there will be four 100-yds. dashes for the men. The biscuit eating contest is popularly a newsboys' game but on this occasion all will have the opportunity of proving themselves to be the biggest eaters in northern British Columbia.
