## 'PRINCESS MAY' SENDS OUT S.O.S.

Former C. P. R. Steamer Returning From West Indies Calls For Assistance.

(Special via U. T. P. Telegraphs.) NEW YORK, Dec. 23.—A wireless S. O. S. message has been received here from the British steamer Princess May formerly owned by the Canadian Pacific Railway Company. The message stated that she was in need of immediate assistance and gave her position as 38.15 North and 73.50 West. The Princess May was approximately a hundred miles east of Delaware Bay and was on her return trip to New York from the West Indies. She was sold by the C. P. R. several months ago and since that time has been engaged in the West Indian fruit trade.

## F. C. WADE TALKS WOODEN HOUSES

Advocates Lumber Construction In Land of Brick and Stone to Solve Housing Problem.

LONDON, Dec. 23.—In a letter to the Times, running to over half a column, F. C. Wade, agent-general for British Columbia, advertises the claims of wooden houses made in Canada as the means of overcoming the house shortage now existing throughout Great Britain. Mr. Wade speaks of the weird and comical attacks made upon wooden houses by Dr. Addison, minister of health, and his officials, and declares that the problem of rehousing Europe can only be met by the rapid construction afforded by wooden houses.
