In the event of Sir Donald Mann refusing to remove Joe Lally from the trustee board of the Mann Cup, emblematic of the world's amateur lacrosse championship, it is reported the V. A. C., who have just successfully defended their title against the Brampton lacrosse team, will return the cup with thanks.

In a letter received from Doughey Spring, the former Westminster star says that the Rosedale team is almost sure to come West this Fall, probably during Exhibition week. Doughey says that Murphy's aggregation is "very fair," which is considered good praise from Doughey.

The small crowds which have turned out so far have certainly been a disappointment, but as nobody is making much money this year anyway, the lacrosse players are no worse off than other people. The V. A. C. players are the ones who have been anxious to quit playing, as practically all the receipts are necessary to pay those men who have received a guarantee."
