Recent despatches tell of the execution of the leader of the German Socialist party because he refused to join the army. The effect of this is very far reaching. The Socialist party in Germany is rapidly approaching a majority of the people, and it is almost unthinkable that the leader of such a large proportion of the people could be executed. It will likely have the effect of turning a large section against the authorities as soon as an opportunity is offered. As long as Germany is winning they will not dare to make a move but with any serious reverses it is very probable that a rising might take place.

This very act of Germany serves to show the contrast of her rule with that of Britain. The British plan has always been one of tolerance. She has well understood the fundamental fact of human nature that restraint is dangerous, while freedom of expression and con duct is a subtle means of letting off suppressed steam.

Germany, on the other hand, always wants to show her authority. A policeman or a soldier stands at every corner and fact, too, explains why so many land and why so many more from the scuppers. are out of sympathy with her! government.
