The fishing schooner Carlotta Cox, which broke down some weeks ago, has been repaired and will return to the fishing banks tomorrow.

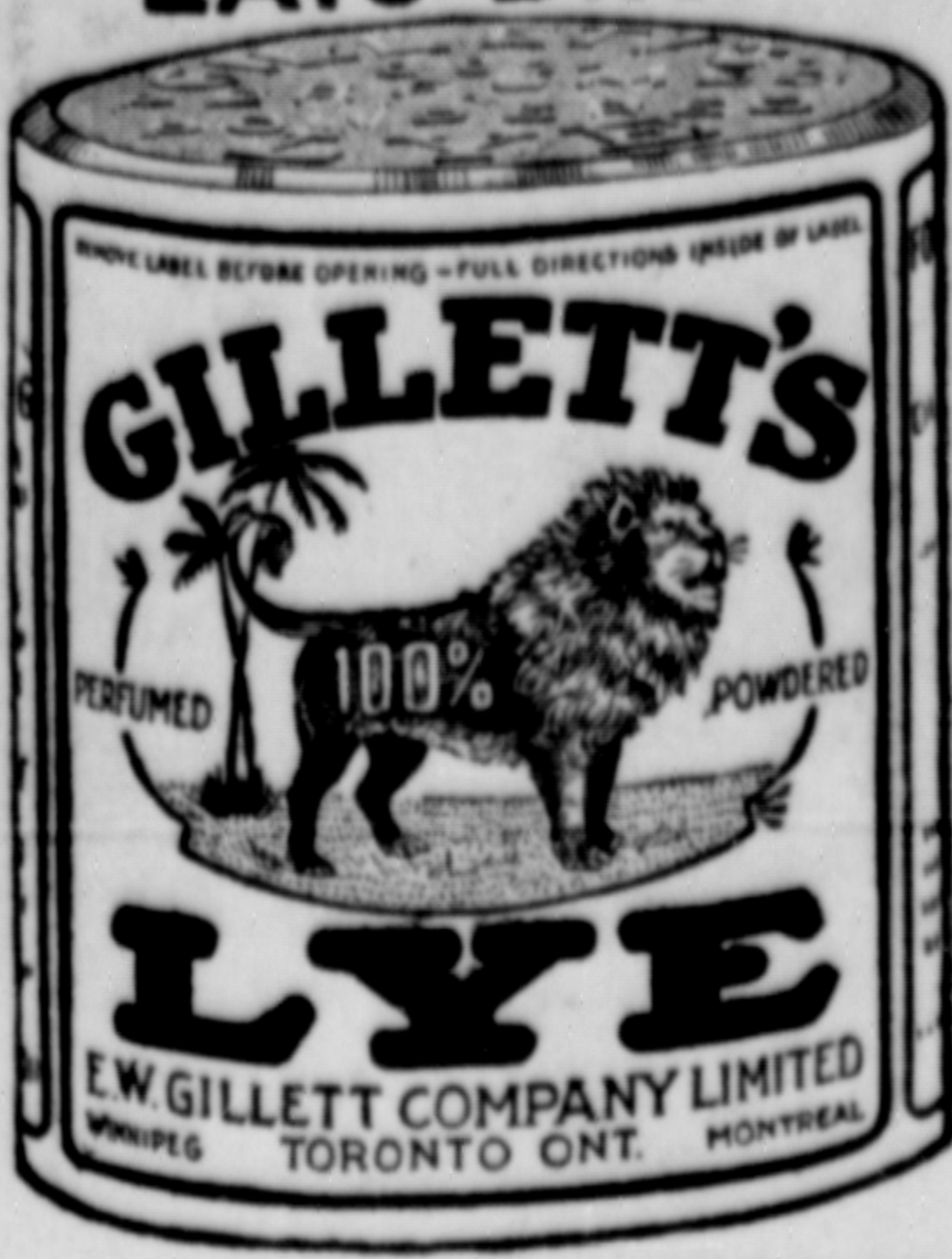
